Groundwater Interim Remedial Measure Operable Unit 3 Bethpage, New York November 2008

We will be working in your neighborhood and we want you to know what we are doing...

Interim Remedial Measure (IRM) construction activities associated with groundwater remediation will continue to be conducted on the access road located immediately south and west of Bethpage Community Park starting November 12, 2008. An "IRM" means actions which can be undertaken without extensive investigation and evaluation to address environmental damage or the consequences of environmental damage attributable to a particular location. The IRM construction activities will be performed by ARCADIS of Melville, New York, on behalf of Northrop Grumman.

This work will be conducted according to plans and design reports that have been approved by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). All work will be performed under the oversight of, and in accordance with methods approved by the NYSDEC.

WHAT WILL WE BE DOING? We will be constructing the IRM. IRM construction activities include: well drilling and development, pump installation, groundwater well/pump testing and treatment system construction. The well development and testing phases of work will involve use of temporary water containers located on Northrop Grumman property and the temporary discharge of treated groundwater to the Nassau County Sanitary Sewer, located on 6th Street, north of Sycamore Avenue.

HOW LONG WILL THIS WORK TAKE? The current work will begin in mid November 2008. We estimate that it will be completed by spring 2009. During this time, the roadway located immediately south and west of Bethpage Community Park will be closed to vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

WHAT SCHEDULE WILL WE FOLLOW? To minimize inconvenience to residents, our activities will be conducted Monday through Friday between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. The work day may be extended beyond 5 p.m. as necessary to complete well drilling activities,

but will be limited to the extent reasonably possible (unless mandated by the NYSDEC). ARCADIS will not work on weekends or on Town holidays without prior approval from Northrop Grumman and the Town.

WHAT TYPE OF EQUIPMENT WILL WE USE? Equipment used will include: trucks, drilling rigs, front-end loaders, dump trucks, temporary surface piping and hoses, cranes, and excavators, as well as jackhammers and welding equipment. Temporary, portable water treatment vessels will also be deployed on the Access Road during the conduct of the groundwater well/pump testing. The work is being conducted by trained personnel in accordance with a NYSDEC-approved Health and Safety Plan (HASP).

WHAT WILL WE DO TO ENSURE THE WORK SITE IS SECURE AND SAFE? Air quality will be monitored continuously during construction activities and dust suppression methods will be used, as necessary. Construction fencing will be installed around construction areas and open trenches will be covered at the end of each day.
