

# NAVY PROJECT UPDATE

Contractors working on behalf of the United States Navy, under agreement with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, will be mobilizing in June 2008 to begin construction on a groundwater remediation (i.e. clean-up) project. This project was initially started in November 2004 with the installation of nine groundwater wells (monitoring, recovery, and injection). The GM-38 Area Groundwater Remediation project includes the extraction (i.e. pumping) of volatile organic compound contaminated groundwater and treatment within a pre-engineered steel building. The majority of the construction will occur in the utility easement that is located east of Broadway Ave., west of the Seaford – Oyster Bay Expressway (Route 135), and between the north and south dead ends of Windhorst and Herman Avenues. Some construction and additional drilling will occur within North Herman Ave. (south of Sophia St.), Broadway Ave., and Arthur Ave.



The construction entrance will be located on the eastern side of Broadway Avenue between residences at 106 Broadway Ave. and 96 Broadway Ave. The sidewalk at this location will be closed during the construction phase. Office trailers will be located near the construction entrance. Chain link fence shall be installed around the area of construction. Work hours will be 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on weekdays.
