

DRILLING NOTICE

Please be advised that the U.S. Navy, in conjunction with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, will be conducting drilling activities in your area very shortly. This work is being conducted to test raw groundwater quality at varying depths below ground surface. Volatile organic compounds (VOCs) have been detected in raw groundwater to the north and this work is part of a continuing investigation into the potential migration of these compounds.

The work will be conducted at Nassau County Storm Water Recharge Basin No. 254 located just north of the intersection between Alken Avenue and Stuart Place, and includes drilling several borings and monitoring wells within the confines of the basin. Raw groundwater samples will be collected and submitted to a local laboratory to test for the presence of VOCs. Once work is completed, the work site will be restored to current conditions. It is anticipated that drilling operations will be conducted over several weeks, and as such, the drill rig, support vehicles and associated equipment should be expected to be present at the basin during this this time.

Nassau County is aware of this investigation and all clearances for accessing the basin for the work have been obtained from the County. Work hours will be Monday through Friday, from approximately 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM.

The onsite contractors for the Navy will be Delta Well & Pump Co., Inc. who will be conducting the drilling operations, and Tetra Tech NUS, Inc. who will be providing environmental engineering oversight and consultation.
