This letter provides a summary to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) of the work conducted at the East Garden City Former Stewart Avenue Holder Station Site (the Site). Public Service Enterprise Group- Long Island (PSEG-LI) performed ground-intrusive activities located at the entrance to the substation on the southern portion of the Site. The intrusive field work occurred on December 8, 2022 and was completed in one day.

The work consisted of excavating two (2) pits measuring approximately two feet by two feet in length and width to an approximate depth of four feet. The test pits were excavated to locate electrical utilities for the light post and entrance gate to the substation. **Figure 1** depicts the work areas on the Site. Excavation activities were conducted by PSEG-LI subcontractor Miller Environmental Group, Inc. utilizing a vacuum excavation rig.

National Grid's Site Investigation and Remediation (SIR) consultant, GEI Consultants Inc. P.C. (GEI) was on-Site during intrusive activities to perform Site Management Plan (SMP) oversight and perform Community Air Monitoring. No exceedances of particulate matter or volatile organic compounds were noted during the excavation activities. Excavated soil was field screened using a photoionization detector and inspected for visual and olfactory impacts. No impacts were noted and the excavated material was used as backfill at the completion of the job.
