The purposes of the meeting, sponsored by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and the New York State Department of Health (DOH) are to discuss the results of the Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study and the Proposed Remedial Action Plan (PRAP) for Operable Unit 2 (OU2) of the Kay-Fries, Inc. Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Site (#344023) as well as the results of the Preliminary Site Assessment (PSA) conducted on 43 acres of land once owned by Kay-Fries, Inc. The site and the area investigated during the PSA are located east of Route 9W in the Town of Stony Point, Rockland County.

The Kay-Fries Site has been divided into two operable units (OU). The 15-acre OU1 parcel is located east of the Conrail railroad tracks. A groundwater collection and treatment remedy is being operated on this parcel. The OU2 parcel consists of seven acres and is located to the west of the Conrail tracks. The 43-acre parcel that was investigated during the PSA is located to the north, west, and south of the OU2 parcel.

A summary of the environmental investigations conducted at the OU2 parcel is presented in the attached Fact Sheet. At the conclusion of the Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study, DEC developed the PRAP for the OU2 parcel. In the PRAP, the DEC is proposing that groundwater collection and treatment and long-term monitoring programs be implemented as the remedy to cleanup contamination on this parcel. The projected cost for this remedy is \$249,000.
