Act Now to Continue Receiving Information About This Site!

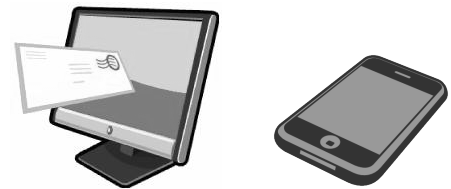
DEC's Division of Environmental Remediation (DER) now distributes information about contaminated sites *electronically by email*.

DER cannot register your email address - only the email address owner can do so. If you already have signed up for the listserv for the county in which the site is located, you need do nothing.

Cleanup Action to Begin at State Superfund Site

Action is about to begin that will address contamination related to the Granite Pointe Subdivision site ("site") located at 144 Route 118, Somers, Westchester County under New York's State Superfund Program. Please see the map for the site location. Tree clearing activities will be performed by Precision Environmental Services, Inc. ("PES"). The cleanup activities are currently being procured; see the following website for more information about the procurement: [Remediation Procurement Opportunities - NYS Dept. of Environmental Conservation](#). Oversight of activities will be provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC).

Tree clearing activities are expected to begin in February 2023 with remedial activities to follow. The entire cleanup is expected to last about seven and a half months. The estimated cost to implement the remedy is between \$8,000,000 and \$12,000,000. The site is listed as a Class "2" site in the State Registry of Inactive Hazardous Waste Sites (list of State Superfund sites). A Class 2 site represents a significant threat to public health or the environment; action is required.

Highlights of the Upcoming Cleanup Activities: The goal of the cleanup action for the site is to achieve cleanup levels that protect public health and the environment. The key components of the remedy are:

- Excavation and off-site disposal of soils that exceed the Site-Specific Soil Cleanup Objectives ("SSSCOs") for unrestricted use, most notably for lead. Treatment to stabilize soils will occur to render soil non-hazardous.
- Collection and analysis of post excavation samples to evaluate the performance of the remedy.

- Management and treatment of construction water generated during the project.
- Site backfill and restoration.

A site-specific Health and Safety Plan (HASP) and a Community Air Monitoring Plan (CAMP) will be implemented during remediation activities. The HASP and CAMP establish procedures to protect on-site workers and residents and includes required air monitoring as well as dust and odor suppression measures.

Next Steps: After cleanup activities are completed, NYSDEC will prepare a Final Engineering Report (FER). The FER will describe the cleanup activities completed and certify that cleanup requirements have been achieved or will be achieved.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the cleanup of the site.

Site Description: The site is located on Route 118 near the intersection of Old Tomahawk Street and Route 202 and is identified as Lots 10-13 in the proposed Granite Pointe development, a future single family residential home subdivision. The site is 4.7 acres of forested vacant land near the Amawalk Reservoir. From about 1938 to 1968, the site was used for trap and target shooting.

Cleanup activities will remove all soil exceeding unrestricted use SSSCOs.

Summary of the Investigation: The primary contaminants of concern at the site are metals

(lead), which are present site-wide in soil and groundwater, and are primarily located in the area of the former shot-fall area along the site's eastern boundary.

State Superfund Program: New York's State Superfund Program (SSF) identifies and characterizes suspected inactive hazardous waste disposal sites. Sites that pose a significant threat to public health and/or the environment go through a process of investigation, evaluation, cleanup and monitoring.

NYSDEC attempts to identify parties responsible for site contamination and require cleanup before committing State funds.

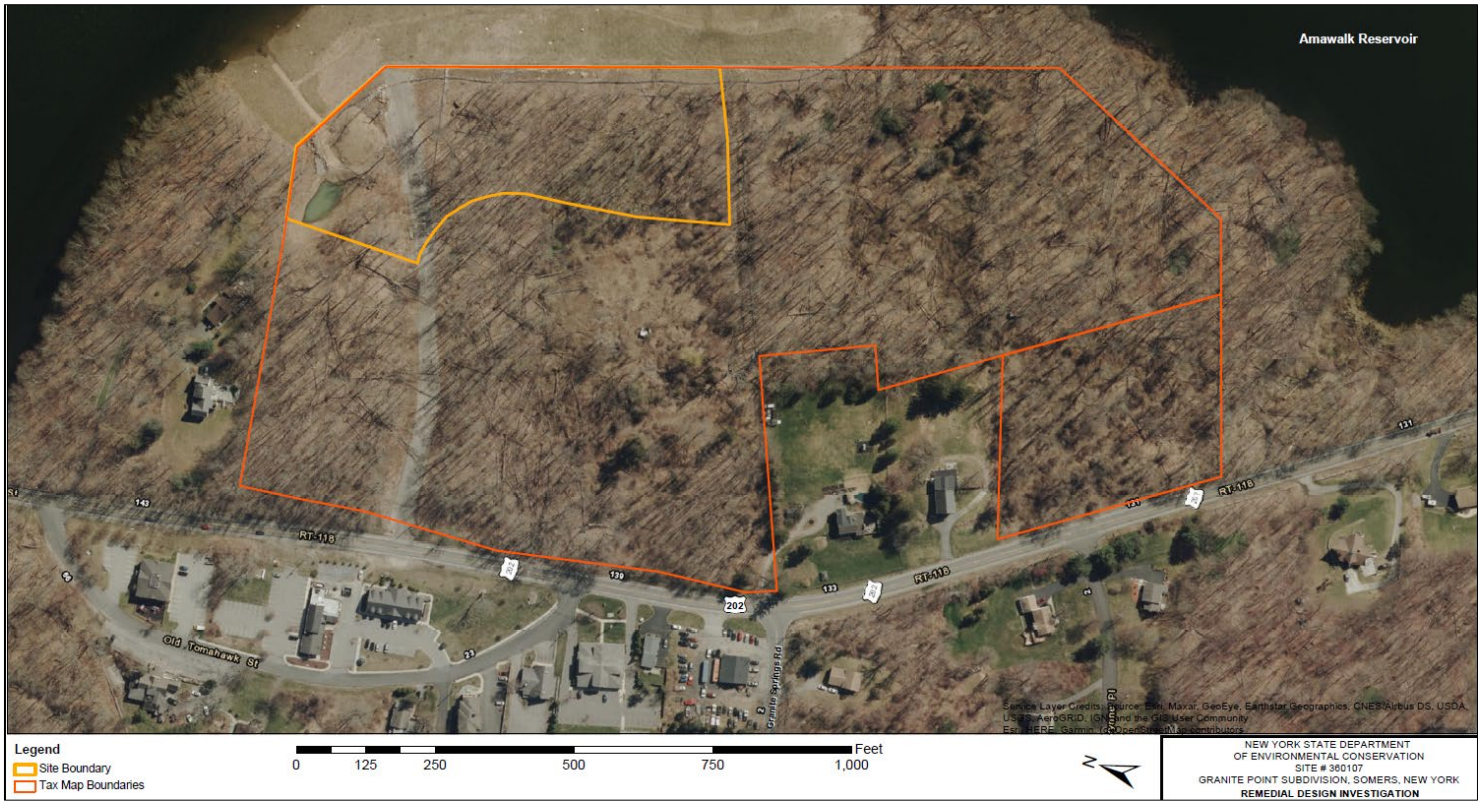
