The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYS DEC) is proposing a cleanup remedy for the Amphenol Facility located at 40-60 Delaware Avenue, Village of Sidney, Delaware County. The proposed remedy is discussed in detail in NYS DEC's Draft Statement of Basis. NYS DEC will present the proposed remedy at a public meeting to be held on September 4, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. at the Sidney Civic Center, Board Room, 21 Liberty Street, Sidney NY 13838. Written comments on the proposed cleanup remedy are being solicited from the public.

1 of 2 8/22/2019, 8:41 AM **Columbia County** - The NYS Office of Parks, Recreation & Historic Preservation, as lead agency, has determined that the proposed Taconic State Park - Orphan Farm Solar Array will not have a significant adverse environmental impact. The action involves installing a ground-mounted solar array consisting of approximately 3,822 solar panels on 4 total acres of field. Construction plans include; driven piles, driven fence posts, a concrete pad for equipment mounting, access road and trenching for electrical wiring. Physical disturbance is calculated to be 0.5 acres which includes the access road, concrete equipment pad, trenching, piles and posts.

Notice of Acceptance of Draft GEIS and Public Hearing

Albany County - The Town of Bethlehem Planning Board, as lead agency, has accepted a Draft Generic Environmental Impact Statement on the proposed Albany Port District Commission Industrial Park Project (Port of Albany Expansion). The public hearing on the Draft GEIS was rescheduled to 6:00pm, September 3, 2019 at the Bethlehem Town Hall, 445 Delaware Avenue, Delmar NY 12054. The public comment period on the Draft GEIS has been extended to September 14, 2019. The Draft EIS is available from the Bethlehem Town Clerk's Office; the Bethlehem Public Library and on line at: www.townofbethlehem.org.

The action involves a proposal by the Albany Port District Commission (Port) to construct an industrial park with 5 conceptual layouts that range from 1.13 million square feet to 160,000 square feet of industrial use facilities (warehouse space and laydown area). Each concept would include associated access roads, employee parking, trailer parking, utility extensions, rail access from the north over Normans Kill and a bulkhead along Hudson River for on and offloading of equipment and materials. The project is located on Port Road South in Glenmont, Town of Bethlehem, New York.
