been released from the Hoosick Falls Landfill and resulted in the potential for people to be exposed to siterelated contaminants through direct contact, ingestion of contaminated drinking water, or through the
consumption of contaminated fish. Additional investigation is recommended to further define the nature and
extent of site-related contamination and to better understand potential exposure pathways.


