

Notice of Upcoming Work at the Bridge Street Former Manufactured Gas Plant Site

In December, as a continuation of an environmental protection program, NYSEG will be performing work at the former manufactured gas plant (MGP) site at 140 Bridge Street in Plattsburgh.

The first step in the cleanup of the site is to demolish the apartment building at the site. It is anticipated that in the spring, following a public information meeting, NYSEG will, at a minimum, remove the remnants of an abandoned gas relief holder and any coal-tar that may have escaped from the gas holder. This work will also help determine whether additional work will be needed at the site.

All work will be done in accordance with a work plan to investigate the site which was developed by NYSEG and approved by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) with the benefit of input from the New York State Department of Health (DOH). The work plan includes a health and safety plan for the protection of worker and public health during work at the site.

The site location is shown on the attached figure.

Site History

Gas was manufactured at the Bridge Street site from 1860 until 1896 when the gas works were moved to a site on Saranac Street. Manufactured gas was produced by heating coal and other petroleum products in the presence of steam. The gas was used by local businesses and residents for lighting, cooking, heating and other purposes.

Byproducts of the manufactured gas process often remained at former MGP sites when the plants were closed. These byproducts can include coal tar, gas purifier wastes and coal ash.

An initial evaluation of the Bridge Street site, including a historical literature search and some sampling of surface soils, was conducted by NYSEG in 1992. Although the evaluation showed no cause for immediate concern, the scope of work was limited and it did indicate the need for further investigation of the site.

In June 1999, NYSEG began a Preliminary Site Assessment of the site to determine if any byproducts from the manufactured gas operation remained at or near the site. That investigation included sampling of surface and sub-surface soils on and near the site, installing groundwater monitoring wells, and collecting air samples from inside the apartment building at the site.

Additional soil borings were conducted in October 1999 to confirm that a portion of the abandoned gas relief holder was located under the on-site apartment building, but in a slightly different location than originally believed. A sample collected from inside the gas holder indicated that at least some of the MGP byproducts in the gas holder were classified as hazardous waste. Air sampling indicated that the MGP byproducts were not affecting air quality in the apartment building. Even so, NYSEG was asked by the former owner to purchase the property, and chose to do so in order to clean up the site.

Document Repositories:



PLATTSBURGH SARANAC STREET FORMER MANUFACTURED GAS PLANT SITE FACT SHEET

INTRODUCTION

In May, as a continuation of an environment protection program, NYSEG will remove the remnants of two gas holder foundations, piping containing coal tar, and purifier waste at the former manufactured gas plant site on Saranac Street in Plattsburgh. The site location and study area are shown on the attached Figure 1.

The public is invited to learn more about the project from NYSEG and the New York State Departments of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and Health (DOH) on **April 18, 2002** at **7 p.m.** at the Plattsburgh City Hall Auditorium.

SITE HISTORY

Gas was manufactured at the Saranac Street site from 1896 until 1960. Manufactured gas was produced by heating coal and other petroleum products in the presence of steam. The gas was used by local businesses and residents for lighting, cooking, heating and other purposes.

Byproducts of the manufactured gas process often remained at former manufactured gas plant sites when plants were closed. These byproducts can include coal tar, purifier wastes and coal ash.

Starting in 1976 NYSEG has extensively investigated the site. Remedial work in the early 1980s included isolating old tar ponds with soil/bentonite slurry walls and an impermeable PVC cover, the removal of coal tar from river sediments, and the construction of a slurry wall adjacent to the Saranac River. In 1988, NYSEG installed a groundwater treatment facility.

PLANNED WORK

Excavation will begin in early May and the work is expected to be completed in 10 weeks. Work will take place Monday through Friday between 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. All excavated material that is removed from the site will be disposed of at permitted facilities.

All work will be done in accordance with a work plan developed by NYSEG and reviewed and approved by the DEC. A health and safety plan, which was reviewed by the DOH, has been developed to protect on-site workers and the community. Air monitoring for coal tar constituents and dust will be conducted during this project.

NYSEG will prepare a final report for review and approval by DEC and DOH. These agencies will decide if any further activities are warranted at this site.
