Inactive landfill reported used from 1940 to 1973 for the disposal of DDT; petroleum, oil, and lubricant saturated wastes; paint, solvent, and pesticide containers; unused ammunition; and general refuse. Portions of this site have been capped with a 20-mil PVC liner, however, the cap is exposed and punctured in many areas. Many drums and containers labelled as solvents, DDT, and petrol@em products are protruding from the slopes of the landfill. Numerous leachate seeps are directly entering surface water.
The US Army has conducted a limited site investigation of this area in conjunction with other sites on the installation. Analysis of surface water and groundwater indicates metals and solvent contamination in excess of NYS Standards.
The USEPA is currently preparing an HRS score for Fort Drum. Preliminary results indicate the facility will be proposed for the National Priorities List.

Attached are the signed forms for listing two Fort Drum sites, the inactive landfill site and the fuel storage site.

While the fuel storage area has serious contamination, I question if it is from a waste. Perhaps this should be handled by the Spill Program or Bulk Storage Program.

A third Fort Drum site, the four square mile agent orange site, is not enclosed. Do we really want to list four square miles of Fort Drum because of spraying in 1959? Do we have any soil or water samples that indicate contamination?
