Remedial Investigation to Begin at Waste Stream, Inc.

A work plan has been approved by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), for a detailed environmental study at the Waste Stream, Inc.. The 25 acre parcel is located at 145 Outer Maple Street, Potsdam, NY and has been operated by Waste Stream as a salvage yard. See map on reverse side showing location of the property. Previous investigations and interim site cleanups have shown portions of the property are contaminated with PCBs, heavy metals and petroleum residuals. As a result the NYSDEC placed this site on the Registry of Inactive Hazardous Waste Disposal Sites as a Class 2 site in 2000. A Class 2 site is a site at which hazardous waste is present and constitutes a significant threat to the public health or the environment; action is required.

The Site Investigation: The NYSDEC entered into an Order on Consent with Waste Stream, Inc., and other responsible parties on December 20, 2000 to conduct a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS). The Remedial Investigation will determine the nature and extent of the contamination both on-site and offsite, as well as potential threats to public health and the environment. As part of the investigation, various environmental media, including groundwater, surface water, soil and sediment will be sampled. The Feasibility Study will be conducted in conjunction with the Remedial Investigation. The Feasibility Study will evaluate possible actions to clean up the site. Based on the results of the RI/FS (which should be available by February 2002), NYSDEC will propose a means for cleaning up the site. Following consideration of public comments on the proposed cleanup plan and it's alternatives, NYSDEC will select a remedy for Waste Stream to implement.

Your Opportunity to Review the RI/FS Work Plan - Copies of the work plan which describes the RI/FS in detail are available for your review at the document repositories listed below. NYSDEC encourages your participation in the project. Your understanding and involvement can help ensure a cleanup program that effectively protects public health and the environment.

Dear Mr. Cubley:

I have been advised that after certain negotiations with the owner of the above referenced Site located adjacent to your client's parcel, your client is not willing to give access to their property for the purposes of environmental sampling. The Site owner is obligated under Order with this Department to conduct such sampling. As you may know, the Environmental Conservation Law authorizes the Department or its authorized agents to enter upon any inactive hazardous waste disposal site, suspected site and areas near such sites for purposes of inspection, sampling, and remediation. ECL 27-1309, 1313(8).

The Department, therefore, is hereby providing notice pursuant to ECL 1313(8) that its agents or other authorized persons will enter upon your real property, known as

, on or after April 23 2001, in order to conduct the sampling required by the Order's workplan. The Department will make every reasonable effort to ensure that any adverse impact of its entry on and occupancy of your property will be minimized. Accordingly, the Department will return the ground surface of the property to its condition before it entered your property, unless you otherwise agree.
