### Description



We arrived on site at 11:45 AM. Almost immediately someone from the Village of Oswego drove up. Payson chatted while Carl, Jerry and I prepared to dismantle the fence and purge monitoring wells.

Later in the afternoon we had another visitor in a gray SUV. This person was concerned that now that the fence was down, kids would have unrestricted access.



We snipped aluminum fasteners, un-bolted clamps and cut the fence fabric where we had to. Will Welling had brought a bolt cutter which was perfect for the job. Using a generator we ran a recipricating saw to cut brush and trees up to five inches in diameter. A chain saw might have been better for the large trees but the electric saw worked out well.
