Notice of Availability: Record of Decision

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) announces that the printed Record of Decision (ROD) for the Former Elite Vogue Dry Cleaners ("site") located at 527-533 East Main Street, Rochester, Monroe County is available for public review at the location(s) identified to the left under "Where to Find Information."

On Wednesday, March 6, 2019 NYSDEC held a public meeting presenting the Proposed Remedial Action Plan for the site. The ROD presents the remedy selected to address contamination related to the site and the rationale for the chosen remedy. The estimated cost to implement the remedy is \$710,000.

Record of Decision: The following is a summary of the chosen remedy described in the ROD:

- Installing a soil vapor extraction (SVE) system to remove volatile organic compounds (VOCs) from beneath the building slab;
- Maintaining the existing site cover;
- Treating contaminated groundwater through injection of chemical oxidants into the groundwater;
- Any off-site buildings impacted by contaminants emanating from the site will be offered a sub-slab depressurization system, or other acceptable measure, to address potential exposures related to soil vapor intrusion; and
- Implementing a Site Management Plan (SMP) for long term maintenance of the remedial systems.

<u>Site Description</u>: The site is located at 527-533 East Main Street on a 0.126-acre parcel. The site is in the downtown area of the City of Rochester, Monroe County. The entire site is covered by a single-story, multi-use commercial building. The building is subdivided into several units including a mini-mart and a diner/luncheonette. The site was occupied by a dry cleaner from 1936 through 2003.

<u>Summary of the Investigation</u>: The primary contaminants of concern at the site are volatile organic compounds (VOCs), which are present in groundwater, soil and soil vapor both on and off-site.
