DEC's Division of Environmental Remediation (DER) now distributes information about contaminated sites electronically by email.

If you would like to continue to receive information about the contaminated site featured in this fact sheet:

**You must sign up for the DER email listserv:**

DER cannot register your email address - only the email address owner can do so. If you already have signed up for the listserv for the county in which the site is located, you need do nothing.

### Pre-Design Investigation to Begin at State Superfund Site

The NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) will soon begin a detailed environmental study at the McKinney Park site ("site") located at W Third St. and Lexington St. Corning, Steuben County. Please see the map for the site location.

**Pre-Design Investigation (PDI) Work Plan:** The PDI work plan was developed by Parsons Engineering of New York, Inc. (Parsons) as NYSDC's consultant under New York's State Superfund Program. The site is listed as a Class "2" site in the State Registry of Inactive Hazardous Waste Sites (list of State Superfund sites). A Class 2 site represents a significant threat to public health or the environment; action is required. NYSDC and the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) will oversee the investigation.

**Highlights of the Site Investigation:** The investigation will define the nature and extent of contamination in soil, surface water, groundwater and any other parts of the environment that may be affected.

Past investigations in the area have determined that metals (namely, arsenic, cadmium, cadmium and lead) and semi-volatile organic compounds (SVOCs) are present site-wide in the soil. This contamination is due to the presence glass manufacturing waste, also known as, ash, brick, and/or glass (ABG) which was formerly used as fill in many areas throughout Corning, NY.

Key components of the investigation work include:

- Sampling of soil in a 75-ft by 75-ft grid pattern across the site, to identify contamination and to understand what areas of the site already contain two feet of clean soil at the surface.

**Next Steps:** The information collected during the investigation will be summarized in a PDI report. After the site investigation is complete, NYSDEC will develop a draft remedial design and work plan for an Interim Remedial Measure (IRM) that includes a clean 2-foot cover across the site. NYSDEC anticipates that the IRM will take place in 2026.

The goal of the IRM will be to ensure the protection of public health and the environment. NYSDEC will announce the availability of the draft cleanup plan in a future fact sheet and will present it to the public for its review and comment during a 30-day comment period and at a community availability session.

**Site Description:** The site is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of W Third St. and Lexington St. The site is approximately 8 acres and is used for community recreational purposes as a City park. The park features include athletic fields, tennis courts, basketball court, picnic areas, a pavilion, restrooms, and a playground area. The site has been used as a park since at least the 1950s. Prior use is not known.
