entering I-390 south; take Route 104 east to Route 88 South in Sodus, continue south on Route into Arcadia and Newark; turn left onto Route 31 east (East Union Street); turn left onto Route 14 north (Geneva Street) on Lyons; turn left onto Canal Street; turn right onto William Street, with the destination into Boheim-Pusateri Funeral Home at 77 William St. Estimated times through Wayne County are 1:25 p.m., Ontario; 1:35 p.m., Williamson; 1:42 p.m., Sodus; 2 p.m., Arcadia/Newark; and 2:15 p.m., Lyons.

On Friday, a graveside service will be held at 11 a.m. at Elmwood Cemetery, 129 Phelps St.

Pagliuso was assigned to the 405th Bombardment Squadron, 38th Bombardment Group, during the war. He was killed in action on or around Oct. 5, 1942, during a bombing mission over Papua New Guinea.

Pagliuso was born to Italian immigrants in 1918 and grew up in Lyons. He enlisted in the Army Air Corps at Mitchel Field, Hempstead, N.Y., on Oct. 3, 1939, and trained as an aerial photographer. He joined the 405th Bombardment Squadron, 38th Bombardment Group, and served in the Southwest Pacific The-

ater during World War II.

On Oct. 5, 1942, he was on board a medium bomber that did not return from a mission over the Territory of Papua (now Papua New Guinea). Officials reported Pagliuso and the six other crew members missing.

Pagliuso was memorialized on the Walls of the Missing at the Manila American Cemetery and Memorial in the Republic of the Philippines. In 2021, the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency recommended the disinterment of these unknown remains with a list of possible candidates for

association; those candidates included Pagliuso. The remains were exhumed in December 2022 and taken to a laboratory in Hawaii for analysis. His remains were confirmed through a DNA match with Pagliuso's maternal niece and sister on March 17, 2025.

This will be the second World War II soldier from Wayne County whose remains were returned after positive identification through the Department of Defense. First Lt. John B. Thomas of Rose was welcomed home in May 2023. He was lost in a bombing mission in Romania during World War II, and his remains were identified through a DNA match with a nephew in 2022.
