## Update issued on Wheatfield landfill remediation

Staff reports

A project to remediate a Town of Wheatfield landfill, which has been used to store materials from Love Canal since the 1960s, will begin this week.

The first phase of the remediation will begin with the removal of trees and brush from the site. A fence will also go up that will close off the remediation site as well as an access road leading to the site from Nash Road. This is expected to take two weeks.

Another two weeks will be spent installing sheeting piling and dewatering the excavation. Following this will be a four-week session in which the contaminated materials will be excavated and disposed of at an off-site location.

Following the removal of the polluted soil, two weeks will be allotted for site restoration and to use clean soil to refill the excavated area.
