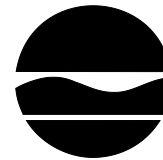

Dear Mr. Mugdan:

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and the New York State Department of Health (DOH), collectively referred to as “the State,” have reviewed the Superfund Proposed Plan dated July 2013 for Operable Unit 1 (OU1) of the Eighteen Mile Creek Superfund Site. We understand the proposed remedy for this operable unit would consist of the acquisition of residential properties along Water Street, the relocation of those residents, the demolition of structures, the fencing of the affected area, and the subsequent excavation of contaminated soils.

We understand that this Superfund Proposed Plan will be presented to the public for comment and a responsiveness summary will be prepared. With this understanding, we concur with the proposed remedy for OU1 of the Eighteen Mile Creek Superfund Site pending review of the final record of decision (ROD) amendment and responsiveness summary.
