Remedial Design Report (RDR) Available Remedial Activities Underway

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) and the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) invite the community to review the Remedial Design Report (RDR) for the Perx Property in the Village of Red Hook. Remediation activity at the site began on October 5, 2005 with asbestos abatement. The RDR is available at the document repositories listed on this fact sheet

Site History: The Perx property is an approximately 20-acre parcel located at 7395 South Broadway in the Village of Red Hook. The property was an apple processing facility beginning in 1949, a frozen food processing and packaging plant from 1955 to some time after 1981, and has been vacant since 1985.

Investigations at the property have identified several environmental conditions of concern. These conditions are summarized in the Environmental
Record of Decision (ROD) issued by the NYSDEC, in February 2005. The ROD and the Final Summary Report of the Site Investigation and Interim Remedial Activities, April 2004, are also available at the document repositories listed on this fact sheet.

<u>Remedial Activities</u>: The RDR describes the remediation activities required by the ROD. These activities include building demolition, asbestos abatement, removal of tanks and waste, soil removal and remediation, installation of groundwater monitoring wells and laboratory analysis.

Demolition of all the buildings on the property will be preceded by asbestos abatement. Demolition also includes removal and proper disposal of waste chemicals, contaminated floor drains, related piping associated with the wastewater treatment system, and any associated contaminated soils. The private on-site electrical system (e.g., pole mounted transformers) will also be removed.

Eleven storage tanks on the property will be removed and disposed of properly, as will any tanks found during the course of remediation. This remedial action will include removal of stored products (and sludge), the tank, contaminated soil, and the final inspection (and testing) of remaining soils.

Soil removal will address environmental concerns related to soils contaminated with pesticides and metals. Soil remediation will include importation of clean fill as necessary. Site restoration activities will also include re-grading, mulching and seeding.
