AM

- Small CAT (320) used grapple to sort through C&D stockpiled E of AOC 2/3.
- Maintenance was performed on front end loader. Operator was in loader during maintenance.
- Dozer, Moxy, red dump, SWC's trailer idle
- Tank & pipe cleaning underway. 2 laborers used a pressure washer and surfactant to attempt to remove oil from pipelines.
- 2 laborers worked on Zone 4/5 restoration; raking, seeding & haying.
- 2 G. Donaldson workers began cutting sheets in Zone 3.
- 1250 and front end loader worked on AOC 1 excavation and loading Central & Riccelli trucks for off-site disposal.
- Front end loader loaded Moxy with crushed concrete. Reportedly to use for haul road for importing stone to AOC 1.

- KW stated Small CAT (320) had been using hammer to size concrete, but hammer had a problem, so moved to sifting through C&D.
- re: Loading sorbent booms onto box truck.
 - As truck moved next to dumpster, I asked KW what was to be loaded into truck from dumpster. KW stated the booms were to be brought to SWC's shop and would be burned in a waste oil incinerator.
 - I told KW I did not see how that was possible, to load solid materials into a waste oil incinerator.
 - KW asked SWC employee (Dave, mechanic) to explain how it worked. Dave stated any liquid could be placed in incinerator and that it can separate the water from oil.
 - KW then called an SWC employee at their shop to explain how it worked. He gave the phone to me, and I stated my name and said I was with the NYSDEC. I explained what KW told me and my question to KW. The person on the phone asked to speak to KW. I gave phone back to KW. KW said Greg would call to explain.
 - Explained all this to Joe Chenier, AH & Scott Smith. Scott Smith stated he had spoken to Greg Paquin & Greg told him the sorbents were never destined for the waste oil incinerator and never have been brought to the waste oil incinerator and that KW was mistaken. (See March 12, 2009 IR and photos.)

Description of work performed by contr. this report period:

- Stamford Wrecking Company (SWC) was in zone 1 performing Asbestos abatement. Asbestos containing soils were loaded out onto 20-Riccelli Trucks for disposal at Seneca Meadows. Trucks were loaded with a Cat 1250 loader.
- Zone 1 was fenced off as an exclusion zone.
- SWC was regrading and stiffening up the east access road with filter fabric and overburden to facilitate truck access to the remaining ACM in the south west corner of AOC 1. The road is currently saturated in places due to recent rainfall, work in progress.
- SWC was steam cleaning petroleum contaminated steel piping on a decon pad in the east part of AOC 2/3. Water was pumped into a poly tank on-site.
- SWC loaded out scrap steel from the site.
- SWC was gathering concrete debris from foundations and other concrete debris and transported to a stockpile in AOC 2. SWC will re-mobilize a crusher to process the concrete debris.
- SWC was using a Bobcat mounted street sweeper to sweep Rinaldi Blvd.
- Enviro Logics was on-site conducting the perimeter air monitoring for the asbestos abatement in zone 1.
- G. Donaldson (Hayward Baker) workers were torch cutting sheetpile, trimming the height, and began installing angles for the pile cap supports in AOC 2/3. Pipe outlet cutouts were begun.

Description of work performed by contr. this report period:

AM

- Maintenance was performed on dozer
- Small CAT (CAT 320) was used to size concrete for part of day
- Front end loader was used to perform a small amount of grading along E side of site (E of AOC 2/3). Approximate area 50' x 30'
- G. Donaldson workers cut tops of sheet piles in Zone 3 and welded plates of lifting eye holes. They were progressing from N to S. ~60-75% done with cutting & ~40-50% done with eye hole plates.
- SWC laborer used pressure washer to clean UST & pipelines. The work zone was not well delineated. Control of spray was insufficient. Fluids generated by dewatering of sump were not well managed. Some of the water was in a large tote ~90% full which appeared to be buckling and had an open top (exposed to rain). Petroleum stained plastic and other waste was on the ground not contained well.
- K&A and BTM delivered loads of 3" +/- stone for backfill in AOC 1.
- 1250 loaded Central & Riccelli trucks with AOC 1 soils for offsite disposal
- Small CAT (CAT 320) also used grapple to remove cut portions of Zone 3 sheet piles

- Front end loader used to spread stone backfill in AOC 1. Working towards SW corner of AOC 1.
- K&A & BTM continued importing 3" +/- stone backfill

Discussions/comments regarding visitors, contractor and/or engineer:

- Discussed tank cleaning with AH. I noted that there was no clear work zones set up and it appeared no air monitoring was being performed.
- Discussed management of drums discovered in stockpile of scraps at S end of Zone 2. AH stated he oversaw the removal of the drums from the stockpile and did not see any that had significant oil in them. They were cleaned of oil along with pipelines and removed as scrap. I questioned about the 1 drum which clearly had product in it. AH said he did not see that. AH stated the operator (John) had started sifting through the pile before he got there.
- Discussed health and safety protocol with KW, AH and Joe Chenier. Reminded KW that workers need to be deconned prior to leaving the exclusion zone. KW stated he would .
- Also discussed dust control, housekeeping (pieces of sheet piles removed) & need for silt fence at S end of Zone 4 with KW, AH & Joe Chenier as well.
