# Draft Investigation Work Plan for Brownfield Site Available for Public Comment

The public is invited to comment on a draft work plan being reviewed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) to investigate the 600 Food Center Drive site ("site") located at 600 Food Center Drive, Bronx, Bronx County. Please see the map for the site location.

#### **Draft Investigation Work Plan**

The draft investigation work plan, called a "Remedial Investigation Work Plan," (RIWP) was submitted to NYSDEC under New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program. The investigation will be performed by the New York City Department of Small Business Services ("applicant") with oversight by NYSDEC and the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH).

# **How to Comment**

NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the Draft RIWP for 30 days, from **December 17 through January 16, 2026.**

# **Highlights of the Proposed Site Investigation**

The investigation will define the nature and extent of contamination in soil, surface water, groundwater and any other parts of the environment that may be affected.

Due to the property's historical use as part of the former Manufactured Gas Plant (MGP) and results from investigations conducted on neighboring sites, it is likely the site may also contain similar MGP-related impacts, such as coal tar and purifier waste.

Key components of the investigation work include:

- Drilling and sampling soil borings to identify possible on-site sources of contamination;
- Collecting soil vapor, sub-slab soil vapor and indoor air samples; and
- Installing and sampling ground water wells to monitor impacts from areas of concern

#### **Next Steps**

NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the plan as necessary, and approve the work plan. NYSDOH must concur with the plan. After the work plan is approved, the activities detailed in the work plan will be implemented.

When the investigation is completed, a report will be prepared and submitted to NYSDEC that summarizes the results. NYSDEC will review the report, make any necessary revisions and, if appropriate, approve the report.

After the investigation, a proposed cleanup plan, called a "Draft Remedial Action Work Plan" will be developed. The cleanup plan will include an evaluation of the proposed site actions, or recommend a no action or no further action alternative. The goal of the cleanup plan is to ensure the protection of public health and the environment. NYSDEC will present the proposed cleanup plan to the public for its review and comment during a 45-day comment period.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

#### **Site Description**

The 9.6- acre site is a portion of a larger tax parcel, Block 2781 Lot 500, located in a commercial and industrial area known as Hunts Point Food Distribution Center in the Bronx. The site is bound to the north by Anheuser-Busch distribution facility (former Voluntary Cleanup Program Site No. V00412), to the east by the Bronx River, to the south by Farragut Street and a waterfront park, and to the west by the BCP site Railroad Right-of-Way BCP (No. C203102) and Food Center Drive. The site is improved with one building, surrounded by asphalt and reinforced concrete slabs for loading docks, with rip-rap along the eastern perimeter bounding the Bronx River.

Historically, the larger Hunts Point area was part of a MGP operated by Consolidated Edison Company (Con Ed) during the first half of the 20th century until it ceased production in the early 1960s and was demolished in 1966. Gas operations included a coke/oven gas plant, a carbureted water gas plant, a light oil plant, and a liquid petroleum production area. In total, the MGP facility covered approximately 182 acres with 46 structures that were actively involved in gas production. Historic maps indicate the BCP site was used for coal storage with railroad tracks and small structure located in the southeastern portion of the property. Prior to construction of the MGP, the BCP site was primarily undeveloped marsh land, with the eastern shoreline being reinforced with a bulkhead as early as 1911. The site will continue to operate as a food production warehouse.

#### **Brownfield Cleanup Program**

New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.


