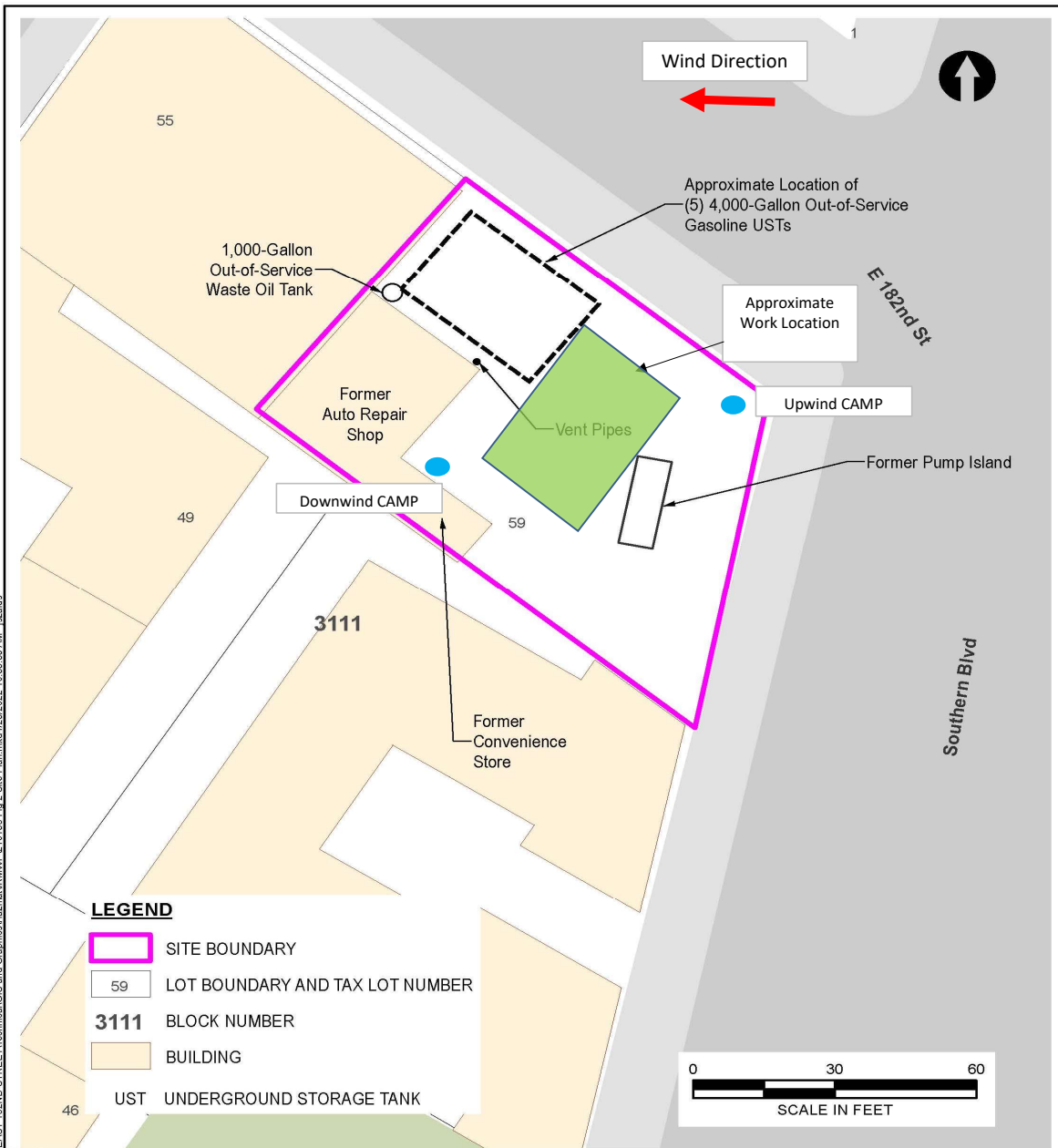

<p>IPT continued to clean three of the 4,000 gallon gasoline USTs. The emptied and cleaned tanks were transported off-site as scrap metal. Tank contents and cleaning fluids were containerized in 55-gallon drums for future off-site disposal.</p>

<p>CAMP Response Actions: VOC exceedances were detected at the upwind CAMP station. AKRF collected supplementary readings at the upwind location using the roving equipment, and the VOC levels were below the action level. Furthermore, AKRF did not observe any activities being conducted near the upwind station that would be expected to cause elevated PID readings and the downwind levels and work zone readings were below the action level. AKRF continued to troubleshoot the PID and after replacing it with a new unit, the concentrations decreased to within normal background levels for the remainder of the day and were consistent with the roving unit.</p>

Planned Work Activity for Next Day/Week:	Removal/cleaning of gasoline and waste oil USTs, associated piping, and any grossly contaminated fill/soil (if encountered). Collection of post-excavation endpoint samples.

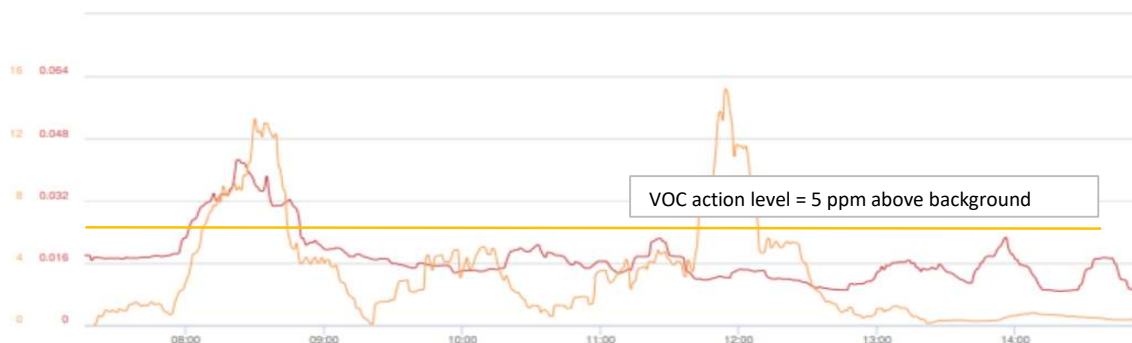
