NYSDEC Certifies Cleanup Requirements Achieved at Brownfield Site

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) has determined that the cleanup requirements to address contamination related to the 650 Southern Boulevard site (“site”) located at 650 Southern Boulevard, Bronx, Bronx County, under New York State’s Brownfield Cleanup Program have been met. Please see the map for the site location.

The cleanup activities were performed by 650 Southern Blvd Bronx LLC (“applicant”) with oversight provided by the NYSDEC. NYSDEC has approved a Final Engineering Report (FER) and issued a Certificate of Completion (COC) for the site.

Completion of the Project

The following activities have been completed to achieve the cleanup action objectives:

- Excavation - Excavation and off-site disposal of approximately 6,500 tons of contaminated historic fill material exceeding the Unrestricted Use soil cleanup objectives, the site-specific cleanup criteria;
- Collection and analysis of post-remedial soil samples to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedy;
- Clean fill was brought in to replace the excavated soil and to establish the design grades at the site;
- Completion of a Soil Vapor Intrusion (SVI) Evaluation following completion of remedial excavation activities;
- Implementation of soil erosion, pollution, and sediment control measures in compliance with applicable laws and regulations;
- Appropriate off-site disposal of material removed from the site in accordance with federal, state, and local regulations for handling, transport, and disposal; and
- Implementation of a Construction Health and Safety Plan and Community Air Monitoring plan during all ground intrusive activities.

Final Engineering Report Approved

NYSDEC has approved the FER, which:

- 1) Describes the cleanup activities completed.
- 2) Certifies that cleanup requirements have been achieved for the site.
- 3) Describes any institutional/engineering controls to be used. An *institutional control* is a non-physical restriction on use of the site, such as a deed restriction, when contamination left over after the cleanup action makes the site suitable for some, but not all uses. An *engineering control* is a physical barrier or method to manage contamination such as a cap or vapor barrier.
- 4) Certifies that a site management plan for any engineering controls used at the site has been approved by NYSDEC.

No institutional controls were required for the site.

Next Steps

With its receipt of a COC, the applicant is eligible to redevelop the site. In addition, the applicant is eligible for tax credits to offset the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site. A COC may be modified or revoked if, for example, there is a failure to comply with the terms of the order or agreement with NYSDEC.

Site Description

The 0.230-acre site is located in the Hunts Point-Longwood neighborhood of the Bronx and bounded to the north by Southern Boulevard followed by a multi-story residential building, to the east by a multi-story residential building, to the south by a commercial building followed by Timpson Place, and to the west by a multi-story residential building followed by Avenue Saint John. Prior to remediation, the site was vacant and developed with two adjoining single-story buildings that covered the entirety of the site. Historical uses of the site include auto-repair, plumbing, and most recently storage for cleaning supplies.

The proposed development will consist of a new 9-story commercial building, including in-patient residential units with an outdoor courtyard.

A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.




