## Interim Remedial Measure Proposed; Public Comment Period Announced

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), is proposing an expedited cleanup of contamination at the Former T&J Salvage site ("Site") located at 2647 Stillwell Avenue Brooklyn, Kings County. Please see the map for the Site location. NYSDEC is conducting a public comment period because this Interim Remedial Measure (IRM) is likely to represent a significant part of the cleanup for the Site. The expedited cleanup activities are expected to begin in December 2024 and last about 2 to 3 months. The activities will be performed by 2647 Stillwell Avenue Property LLC ("Applicant") with oversight provided by NYSDEC.

**How to Comment:** NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the proposed plan for 30 days, from **October 23rd** through **November 22nd, 2024**.

**Draft Interim Remedial Measure (IRM) Work Plan:** An IRM is a cleanup activity that may be performed when a source of contamination or exposure pathway (the way in which a person may contact contamination) can be effectively addressed without extensive investigation and evaluation.

The draft IRM work plan describes proposed cleanup activities that include:

- Excavating and disposing off-site petroleum-contaminated soil to approximately 10 feet below surface grade across three hotspot areas to achieve a Track 4 Commercial Use cleanup;
- Treating residual petroleum contamination in groundwater by applying a chemical oxidant into the open excavation areas;
- Collecting and analyzing post-excavation soil samples to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedy;
- Removing any underground storage tanks (USTs), if encountered during excavation;

- Importing clean material that meets the established Soil Cleanup Objectives for use as backfill; and
- Implementing a Health and Safety Plan (HASP) and

Community Air Monitoring Plan (CAMP) during all ground intrusive activities.

**Site Description:** The approximately 1.87-acre Site currently consists of an unoccupied concrete-paved lot with empty metal storage racks and former office trailers. The Site is bounded by an easement associated with the Belt Parkway, followed by Belt Parkway to the north; MTA train tracks, followed by vacant land to the east; a concrete-paved roadway and Coney Island Creek to the south; and Stillwell Avenue, followed by Coney Island Creek to the west. Historic uses include various auto salvage and wrecking operations and a concrete and building materials supplier.

The proposed future use of the Site includes trucking, trailer and equipment parking, and distribution. No buildings will be constructed on-site.

**Summary of the Investigation:** The primary contaminants of concern at the site are petroleum-related volatile organic compounds (VOCs) which are present in soil and groundwater, likely related to the Site's former automotive uses.

**Next Steps:** NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the plan as necessary, and approve the IRM work plan in consultation with the NYSDOH. The approved work plan will be made available to the public (see "Where to Find Information" on the front page).

When the expedited cleanup activities are completed, an IRM Completion Report will be prepared that documents the activities that were performed.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the Site.

**Brownfield Cleanup Program:** New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.

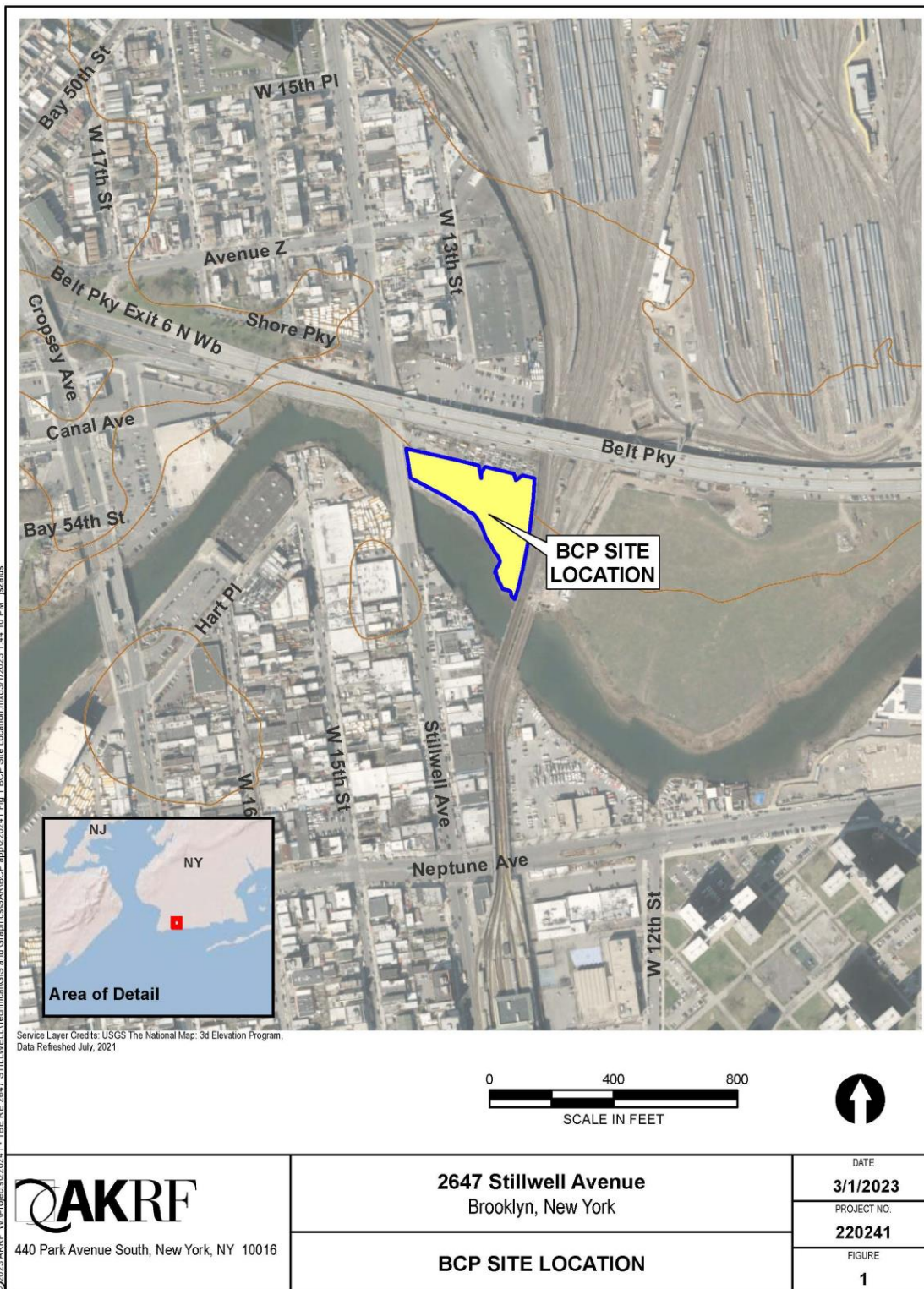
