Cleanup Action Completed at Brownfield Site

Action has been completed to address the contamination related to the 644 East 14th Street Site ("site") located at 644 East 14th Steet, Manhattan, NY under New York State's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP). Please see the map for the site location.

Cleanup activities were performed by 644 East 14th Street Owner LLC ("applicant") with oversight provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). The applicant has submitted a proposed Final Engineering Report (FER) for NYSDEC review which states that cleanup requirements have been or will be achieved to fully protect public health and the environment for the proposed site use.

Highlights of the Site Cleanup: The following activities have been or will shortly be completed to achieve the remedial action objectives:

- Excavation Excavation and off-site disposal of about 7,900 cubic yards of contaminated historic fill material exceeding the Unrestricted Use soil cleanup objectives (UUSCOs), the site-specific cleanup criteria. Clean fill was and will be brought in to replace the excavated soil and to establish the design grades at the site.
- Evaluation of soil vapor intrusion following soil removal.

Next Steps: When NYSDEC approves the FER, it will be made available to the public (see "Where to Find Information"). NYSDEC then will issue a Certificate of Completion (COC) that will be announced in a fact sheet. The applicant would be able to redevelop the site after receiving a COC. In addition, the applicant will be eligible for tax credits to offset a portion of the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site.

BROWNFIELD CLEANUP PROGRAM

Site Description: The site is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Avenue C and East 14th Street and is identified as Block 396, Lot 29 on the New York City tax map. The site is a rectangular parcel 0.232-acres in size and is currently an active construction site. Prior to construction, the site was a vacant lot. From about 1900 through the 1970s, several multi-story commercial buildings occupied the site. It was used most recently as an auto service business from the 1970s to the 2010s. In the mid-2010s the building containing the auto-service business was demolished.

The site is being redeveloped into a 24-story mixed use commercial and residential building.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business, or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where

a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the SCOs or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by NYSDEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.


