# NYSDEC Certifies Cleanup Requirements Achieved at Brownfield Site

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) has determined that the cleanup requirements to address contamination related to the 644 East 14th Street Site ("site") located at 644 East 14th Street, Manhattan, NY, under New York State's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) have been met. Please see the map for the site location.

The cleanup activities were performed by 644 East 14th Street Owner LLC ("applicant") with oversight provided by the NYSDEC. NYSDEC has approved a Final Engineering Report (FER) and issued a Certificate of Completion (COC) for the site.

**Completion of the Project:** The following activities have been completed to achieve the remedial action objectives:

- Excavation Excavation and off-site disposal of about 7,900 cubic yards of contaminated historic fill material exceeding the Unrestricted Use soil cleanup objectives (UUSCOs), the site-specific cleanup criteria. Clean fill was brought in to replace the excavated soil and to establish the design grades at the site.
- Evaluation of soil vapor intrusion following soil removal.

**Final Engineering Report Approved:** NYSDEC has approved the FER, which:

- 1) Describes the cleanup activities completed.
- 2) Certifies that cleanup requirements have been achieved for the site.

**Next Steps:** With its receipt of a COC, the applicant is eligible to redevelop the site. In addition, the applicant is eligible for tax credits to offset the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site. A COC may be modified or revoked if, for example, there is a failure to comply with the terms of the order or agreement with NYSDEC.

### **BROWNFIELD CLEANUP PROGRAM**

**Site Description:** The site is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Avenue C and East 14th Street and is identified as Block 396, Lot 29 on the New York City Tax Map. The site is a rectangular parcel 0.232-acres in size and is currently an active construction site. Prior to construction, the site was a vacant lot. From about 1900 through the 1970s, several multi-story commercial buildings occupied the site. It was used most recently as an auto service business from the 1970s to the 2010s. In the mid-2010s the building containing the auto-service business was demolished.

The site is being redeveloped into a 24-story mixed use commercial and residential building.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business, or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels

exceeding the soil cleanup objectives (SCOs) or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by NYSDEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.


