# **Environmental Cleanup to Begin at Brownfield Site**

Action is about to begin that will address contamination related to the 252 Third Avenue ("site") located at 252-258 Third Avenue, Manhattan, New York County. Please see the map for the site location. The cleanup activities will be performed by Gramercy 252 Owner LLC ("applicant") with oversight provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). NYSDEC has determined that the Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP) protects public health and the environment and has approved the plan.

Cleanup activities are expected to begin in September 2025 and last about 21 months.

### **Highlights of the Upcoming Cleanup Activities**

The goal of the cleanup action for the site is to achieve cleanup levels that protect public health and the environment. The key components of the cleanup are:

- Removing underground storage tanks in accordance with local, state, and federal regulations;
- Excavation and off-site disposal of approximately 3,000 cubic yards of contaminated soil;
- Collecting and analyzing post-cleanup soil, groundwater, and soil vapor samples to evaluate the
  effectiveness of the cleanup;
- Extraction of contaminated groundwater, if necessary;
- Treatment of contaminated groundwater through the application of enhanced bioremediation and chemical injections, if necessary;
- Installation of a Soil Vapor Extraction System to prevent the migration of contaminated soil vapor off-site;
- If post-cleanup soil vapor samples indicate continued soil vapor concerns, then a Sub-Slab Depressurization System will be installed in the proposed building;
- Importing clean material that meets the established Soil Cleanup Objectives for use as backfill;
- Implementing a Health and Safety Plan (HASP) and Community Air Monitoring Plan (CAMP) during all ground intrusive activities;
- If an Unrestricted Use cleanup is not achieved, implementation of a Site Management Plan would also be required for long term maintenance of the remedial systems; and
- If an Unrestricted Use cleanup is not achieved, recording of an Environmental Easement to ensure proper use of the site may be necessary.

The HASP and CAMP establish procedures to protect on-site workers and residents and includes required air monitoring as well as dust and odor suppression measures.

#### **Next Steps**

After the applicant completes the cleanup activities, they will prepare a Final Engineering Report (FER) and submit it to NYSDEC. The FER will describe the cleanup activities completed and certify that cleanup requirements have been achieved or will be achieved.

When NYSDEC is satisfied that cleanup requirements have been achieved or will be achieved for the site, it will approve the FER. NYSDEC will then issue a Certificate of Completion (COC) to the applicant. The applicant would be able to redevelop the site in conjunction with receiving a COC. In addition, the applicant would be eligible for tax credits to offset the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site.

NYSDEC will issue a fact sheet that describes the content of the FER. The fact sheet will identify any institutional controls (for example, environmental easements) or engineering controls (for example, a site cover) necessary at the site in relation to the issuance of the COC.

#### **Site Description**

The 0.320-acre site is located in the Gramercy Park neighborhood of Manhattan and is bounded to the north by East 21<sup>st</sup> Street followed by residential apartments, to the east by Third Avenue followed by residential apartments, to the south by residential apartments followed by East 20<sup>th</sup> Street, and to the west by Gramercy Park East followed by Gramercy Park. The site consists of 6 recently vacated lots having a variety of uses, coupled with residential apartments. Historical uses of the site include various commercial and manufacturing uses, grocery store, coffee shop, nail salon, dry cleaners, restaurant/bar, and residential apartments.

The proposed redevelopment includes complete demolition of the existing buildings and construction of a new up to 20-story residential building with an affordable housing component, containing ground floor commercial or community facility space. Demolition of the existing buildings has already begun and is ongoing.

A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.
