### Remedy Proposed for Brownfield Site Contamination; Public Comment Period Announced

The public is invited to comment on a proposed remedy being reviewed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), to address contamination related to the 990-1026 Rossville Avenue site ("site") located at 990-1026 Rossville Avenue, Staten Island, NY. Please see the map for the site location.

Based on the findings of the investigation, NYSDEC in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) has determined that the site poses a significant threat to public health or the environment. This decision is based on the nature of the existing contaminants identified at the site; the potential for off-site migration of contaminants in the groundwater; and the potential for human exposure to site-related contaminants in soil vapor. To address this threat, NYSDEC has developed the proposed remedy summarized below.

**How to Comment:** NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the proposed plan, called a "Draft Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP)" for 45 days, from **July 6 through August 19, 2023**.

**Draft Remedial Work Plan:** The proposed Commercial Use remedy consists of:

- Excavation and off-site disposal of soil exceeding the protection of groundwater soil cleanup objectives (SCOs) to a depth of up to 7 feet below surface grade in an approximately 190-square feet area in the western portion of the site;
- Collecting and analyzing end-point soil samples to confirm that the applicable SCOs have been achieved;
- Importing clean material that meets the established SCOs for use as backfill;
- Treating contaminated groundwater via enhanced in-situ (in-place) bioremediation;
- Collecting and analyzing post-remedial groundwater and soil vapor samples to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedy;
- Maintenance of the existing site cover system consisting of concrete building slabs, asphalt paving, and/or a minimum of 1 foot of soil meeting the commercial use SCOs;

- Implementing a Health and Safety Plan and Community Air Monitoring Plan during all ground intrusive activities:
- Continued operation of the sub-slab depressurization system that was previously installed as an Interim Remedial Measure;
- Implementing a Site Management Plan for long term maintenance of the remedial systems; and,
- Recording of an Environmental Easement to ensure proper use of the site.

The proposed remedy was developed by Allied Rossville LLC ("applicant") after performing a detailed investigation of the site under New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP). A "Draft Remedial Investigation Report", which describes the results of the site investigation was submitted prior to the Draft Remedial Action Work Plan and is also available for review at the locations identified on Page 1.

**Next Steps:** NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the cleanup plan as necessary, and issue a final Decision Document. NYSDOH must concur with the proposed remedy. After approval, the proposed remedy becomes the selected remedy. The applicant may then design and perform the cleanup action to address the site contamination, with oversight by NYSDEC and NYSDOH.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

Site Description: The site is approximately 1.53-acres and is bordered on the west by asphalt-paved tennis courts that are part of the Woodbrooke Estates residential community, on the south by Grafe Street followed by three two-story townhouse buildings associated with the Woodbrooke Estates residential community, on the east by Rossville Avenue followed by a two-story mixed-use residential/commercial building and a two-story residential building, and on the north by three two-story residential buildings. It is currently developed with an approximately 25,800-square foot one-story shopping center that was constructed in 1990 and is currently occupied by a liquor store, beauty salon, karate studio, ice cream parlor, grocery store, restaurant, bagel shop, laundromat, pizzeria, a vacant former restaurant, and a vacant former dry cleaner that is being renovated as a nail salon. A cellar is located beneath

the grocery store in the northwestern corner of the shopping center. The remaining portions of the site consist of an asphalt-paved parking lot in the southeastern portion of the site and an access road for deliveries along the western and northern perimeters of the site.

**Summary of the Investigation:** The primary contaminants of concern at the site are chlorinated volatile organic compounds, which are present in soil, groundwater, and soil vapor in the western portion of the site in the vicinity of the former dry cleaner.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by NYSDEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.
