Draft Investigation Work Plan for Brownfield Site Available for Public Comment

The public is invited to comment on a draft work plan being reviewed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) to investigate the Plesser Property site ("site") located at Paradies Lane, New Paltz, Ulster County. Please see the map for the site location. Documents related to the cleanup of this site can be found at the location(s) identified below under "Where to Find Information."

Draft Investigation Work Plan

The draft investigation work plan, called a "Remedial Investigation Work Plan," was submitted to NYSDEC under New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program. The investigation will be performed by Mega Funworks, Inc. ("applicant(s)") with oversight by NYSDEC and the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH).

How to Comment

NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the draft investigation work plan for 30 days, from **November 25, 2015** through **December 28, 2015**. The proposed plan is available for review at the location(s) identified below under "Where to Find Information." Please submit comments to the NYSDEC project manager listed under Project Related Questions in the "Who to Contact" area below.

Highlights of the Proposed Site Investigation

The investigation will define the nature and extent of contamination in soil, surface water, groundwater and any other parts of the environment that may be affected.

There are two potential sources of contamination.

There is an underground storage tank (UST) in the northern section of the property which contains a water/petroleum mixture. The subsurface soil around the UST has been found to have low levels of butylbenzene, trimethylbenzene, and isopropyl toluene. These levels do not exceed the unresticted use Soil Cleanup Objectives (SCOs).

Surface soil from the center area of the site is contaminated with arsenic, lead, and a variety of

pesticides. These are likely from overspray of pesticides in the orchard. While all of these contaminants exceed the protection of ecological resources SCOs, only arsenic exceeds the restricted residential use SCOs. Eleven of the 26 samples exceed the SCO with a maximum of 114ppm.

Next Steps

NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the plan as necessary, and approve the work plan. NYSDOH must concur with the plan. The approved work plan will be made available to the public (see "Where to Find Information" below). After the work plan is approved, the activities detailed in the work plan will be implemented.

When the investigation is completed, a report will be prepared and submitted to the NYSDEC that summarizes the results. NYSDEC will review the report, make any necessary revisions and, if appropriate, approve the report.

After the investigation, a cleanup plan, called a "Remedial Work Plan" will be developed and a Decision Document will be proposed. The cleanup plan will include an evaluation of the proposed site remedy, or recommend a no action or no further action alternative. The goal of the cleanup plan is to ensure the protection of public health and the environment. NYSDEC will present the proposed cleanup plan to the public for its review and comment during a 45-day comment period. NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

Background

Location: The Plesser Property site is located in a rural area in the Town of New Paltz. The site does not have a physical address and is located south of Main St (Rt 299) and Paradies Lane, west of Ohioville Rd, east of a ramp for Interstate 87, and north of Dietz Lane.

Site Features: The irregular-shaped site contains grassy fields and wooded land. A small portion of the northernmost tax lot is landscaped. The central portion of the site contains grassy fields, the southernmost portion is wooded with wetlands delineated. Remnants of foundations, concrete paved areas, and an asphalt driveway are located in the northwestern section of the site. Several trails are present on the western and central sections.

Current Zoning/Use: The site lies within two different zones: the southern parcel is zoned I-1, Light Industrial Zoning District; while the northern parcel is zoned B-2, Highway Business Zoning District. The site is currently vacant, though an encroachment is noted on the east central section of the site where an adjacent auto-repair facility stores automobiles on an approximately 10,000 square-foot paved area.

Historical Use: The site has historically operated as a commercial orchard.

Site Geology and Hydrogeology: The site topography is relatively flat but slopes slightly to the northeast. Surface elevations on the Site range from 360 feet above mean sea level (msl) near the northeastern section of the Site to 380 feet above msl on the western section of the Site.

There are two soil types in the area of the Site: 1) glacial till (a loamy mixture of clay, silt-clay, and boulder clay) and 2) glacial outwash sand and gravel deposits.

Bedrock in the area of the Site is the Ordovician-aged Normanskill Formation consisting of shale, argillite, and siltstone.

Regional groundwater flow is expected to be east-northeast. On-site groundwater flow would be influenced by site-specific geologic conditions, which have not yet been determined. Shallow groundwater flow is likely to be toward the wetland bodies located to the east and west of the site.
