### Remedy Proposed for Brownfield Site Contamination; Public Comment Period Announced

The public is invited to comment on a proposed remedy being reviewed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), to address contamination related to the Former Ludlow Street Works site ("site") located at 150 Downing Street, 58 Knowles Street, 55 Knowles Street and 1 Bridge Street, Yonkers, Westchester County. Please see the map for the site location.

How to Comment: NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the proposed plan, called a "Draft Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP)" for 45 days, from March 23 through May 11, 2023.

**Draft Remedial Work Plan:** The proposed restricted residential use remedy, which will include an area allowing unrestricted use, consists of:

- Excavation and off-site disposal of contaminated soil to an approximate depth of 26 feet below ground surface (bgs) across the northeastern portion of the site. Excavation and removal of coal tar-impacted soil to an approximate depth of 40 feet bgs in the northern portion of the site;
- Solidification of approximately 5,700 cubic yards of subsurface soil containing coal tar to a depth of 38 feet bgs which will slow groundwater flow and inhibit the migration of contaminants;
- Collection and analysis of soil samples to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedy;
- Placement of a soil cover to address contamination remaining above restricted residential use soil cleanup objectives;
- Importing clean material that meets the established Soil Cleanup Objectives for use as backfill; and,
- Implementing a Health and Safety Plan and Community Air Monitoring Plan during all ground intrusive activities.

The proposed remedy was developed by Ludlow Point Development, LLC ("applicant") after performing a detailed investigation of the site under New York's Brownfield

Cleanup Program. A "Remedial Investigation Report" which describes the results of the site investigation is also available for review at the locations under Where To Find Information.

## **BROWNFIELD CLEANUP PROGRAM**

**Next Steps:** NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the cleanup plan as necessary, and issue a final Decision Document. NYSDOH must concur with the proposed remedy. After approval, the proposed remedy becomes the selected remedy. The applicant may then design and perform the cleanup action to address the site contamination, with oversight by NYSDEC and NYSDOH.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

**Site Description:** The site consists of four lots located at 150 Downing Street, 58 Knowles Street, 55 Knowles Street and 1 Bridge Street. The 3.46-acre site is in a mixed industrial and residential area and is bound to the north by a park, to the south by Ludlow Street, to the east by residential properties and to the west by a commuter railroad. A manufactured gas plant operated on the Downing Street parcel between 1879 and 1936. Past uses at the Knowles Street parcel include the manufacturing of medical supplies, metal gears, shampoo and power equipment. The Bridge Street parcel was previously used as an auto repair facility. The site is being redeveloped for two approximately 36,000 square-foot multi-unit residential buildings and an associated parking garage. The site is anticipated to achieve an unrestricted use cleanup for the North Building Footprint (see page 3) and a restrictedresidential use for the remaining area.

**Summary of the Investigation:** The primary contaminants of concern are volatile organic compounds and semivolatile organic compounds in soil and groundwater, primarily in the area of the former manufactured gas plant operations.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.


