Cleanup Action Completed at Brownfield Site

Action has been completed to address the contamination related to the Cottage Place Gardens Phase 5 Parcel site ("site") located at 172 and 178 Warburton Avenue, Yonkers, Westchester County under New York State's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP). Please see the map for the site location.

Cleanup activities were performed by 178 Warburton Limited Partnership ("applicant") with oversight provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). The applicant has submitted a draft Final Engineering Report (FER) for NYSDEC review which states that cleanup requirements have been or will be achieved to fully protect public health and the environment for the proposed site use.

Highlights of the Site Cleanup: The following activities have been or will shortly be completed to achieve the remedial action objectives:

- Excavation Excavation and off-site disposal of about 39,000 cubic yards of petroleum-impacted soil and contaminated historic fill material exceeding the unrestricted use soil cleanup objectives (UUSCOs), the site-specific cleanup criteria. Clean fill was and will be brought in to replace the excavated soil and to establish the design grades at the site.
- Removal of four (4) underground storage tanks and three (3) underground hydraulic lifts.
- In-Situ (in-place) Soil Amendment Regenesis Petro FixTM and ORC Advanced® Pellets were applied over the western portion of the site to treat residual volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in the groundwater.

Next Steps: When NYSDEC approves the FER, it will be made available to the public (see "Where to Find Information"). NYSDEC then will issue a Certificate of Completion (COC) that will be announced in a fact sheet. The applicant(s) can redevelop the site after receiving a COC. In addition, the applicant(s) will be eligible for tax credits to offset a portion of the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site.

A COC may be modified or revoked if, for example, an applicant does not comply with the terms of its Brownfield Cleanup Agreement with NYSDEC.

Site Description: The site is 1.401 acres in size and is located at 178 Warburton Avenue (Tax Parcel 2-2095-30). Before demolition the site contained three multistory apartment buildings. The former structure at 178 Warburton Avenue was historically utilized as a gasoline station and motor repair facility.

The post-cleanup development plan includes multifamily residential buildings, a community center, and open space recreation and parking.

Brownfield York's Cleanup **Program:** New Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil objectives health-based cleanup or other

environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.



Site Location




