Environmental Cleanup to Begin at Brownfield Site

Action is about to begin that will address contamination related to the YMCA White Plains site ("site") located at 250 Mamaroneck Avenue, White Plains, Westchester County. Please see the map for the site location. The cleanup activities will be performed by Mamaroneck White Plains, LLC ("applicant") with oversight provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). NYSDEC has determined that the Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP) protects public health and the environment and has approved the plan.

Remedial activities are expected to begin late August or September 2022 and last about six months.

Highlights of the Upcoming Cleanup Activities: The goal of the cleanup action for the site is to achieve cleanup levels that protect public health and the environment. The key components of the remedy are:

- Excavation and off-site disposal of petroleum-impacted soil and historic fill exceeding unrestricted use soil cleanup objectives. Approximately 6,200 cubic yards of soil will be excavated to a depth ranging from approximately 1 foot to 10 feet below ground surface as shown on the attached figure. Clean backfill, that meets the NYSDEC soil cleanup objectives, will be used to provide the final grade.
- Collection and analysis of post-excavation soil samples to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedy.

The activities are expected to achieve an unrestricted use cleanup standard.

A site-specific health and safety plan (HASP) and a Community Air Monitoring Plan (CAMP) will be implemented during remediation activities. The HASP and CAMP establish procedures to protect on-site workers and residents and includes required air monitoring as well as dust and odor suppression measures.

Next Steps: After the applicant completes the cleanup activities, they will prepare a Final Engineering Report (FER) and submit it to NYSDEC. The FER will describe the cleanup activities completed and certify that cleanup requirements have been achieved or will be achieved.

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When NYSDEC is satisfied that cleanup requirements have been achieved or will be achieved for the site, it will approve the Final Engineering Report. NYSDEC will then issue a Certificate of Completion to the applicant. The applicant would be able to redevelop the site in conjunction with receiving a Certificate of Completion. In addition, the applicant would be eligible for tax credits to offset the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site.

NYSDEC will issue a fact sheet that describes the content of the Final Engineering Report. The fact sheet will identify any institutional controls (for example, environmental easements) or engineering controls (for example, a site cover) necessary at the site in relation to the issuance of the Certificate of Completion.

Site Description: The site is located opposite the intersection of Mamaroneck Avenue and Carhart Avenue in central White Plains. The 1.16-acre site is currently vacant following the demolition of the YMCA building earlier this year. The site borders Mamaroneck Avenue on the east. Commercial offices and retail properties border the site on the north, east and south. Residential properties border the site to the west. While not yet finalized, the development plans call for a 177-unit rental building with limited retail space.

York's **Brownfield** Cleanup Program: New Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other healthbased or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.

Site Location




Figure 1: YMCA White Plains 250 Mamaronack Avenue City of White Plains, Westchester County
