Cleanup Action Completed at Brownfield Site

Action has been completed to address the contamination related to the St. Clair Hotel Dry Cleaning Site ("site") located at 34, 36, 28 Main Street, Yonkers, Westchester County under New York State's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP). Please see the map for the site location.

Cleanup activities were performed by St. Clair Owners LLC and St. Clair Development, LLC ("applicants") with oversight provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). The applicants have submitted a proposed Final Engineering Report (FER) for NYSDEC review which states that cleanup requirements have been or will be achieved to fully protect public health and the environment for the proposed site use.

Highlights of the Site Cleanup: The following activities have been or will shortly be completed to achieve the remedial action objectives:

- Excavation Excavation and off-site disposal of about 7,200 cubic yards of contaminated soil exceeding the Unrestricted Use soil cleanup objectives, the site-specific cleanup criteria. Non-remedial soils were further excavated to support the development of the site.
- In-Situ (in-place) Chemical Reduction This is a technology that
 was used to treat residual volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in
 the groundwater. Zero Valent Iron was injected into groundwater
 below the remedial excavation to form a permeable reactive barrier
 along the southern site boundary in order to contain groundwater
 on-site. In addition, spot injections were performed within the
 southwestern area of the site where VOCs in exceedance of
 Aqueous Water Quality Standards were observed during the
 Remedial Investigation.
- A Soil Vapor Intrusion evaluation was performed to determine if an engineering control to control intrusion was required.
 Development of a Site Management Plan (SMP) for short-term management of residual groundwater contamination as required by the Environmental Easement, including plans for: (1) Institutional and Engineering Controls (IC/ECs); (2) monitoring; and (3) reporting.
- An Environmental Easement was recorded to prevent future exposure to any contamination remaining at the site and to ensure implementation of the SMP.

Next Steps: When NYSDEC approves the FER, it will be made available to the public (see "Where to Find Information"). NYSDEC then will issue a Certificate of Completion (COC) that will be announced in a fact sheet. The applicant(s) would be able to redevelop the site after receiving a COC. In addition, the applicant(s) will be eligible for tax credits to offset a portion of the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site.

Site Description: The site is located at 34, 36, & 38 Main Street in the City of Yonkers Westchester County and is identified as tax lots 1-501-18, 19, & 20. The site is about 0.214 acres in size and is located on the corner of Main Street and Riverdale Ave. Adjoining the site is a telecommunications building owned by Verizon to the south, and a restaurant to the west. Historic site use included various commercial and retail operations and notably the St. Clair Hotel in the mid-1900s.

Excavation for the site is complete and all soils exceeding UUSCOs have been removed. The site is currently under development as a multistory affordable housing project that includes several levels of underground parking, and street level amenities. The foundations for the development have been completed and construction is in progress.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.


