A. Site Location

The Site is located in the City of White Plains, New York 10601. The Site is located in a commercial, residential and governmental buildings area. To the north and east of the Site are buildings used for commercial, residential and office purposes. There is also a park located to the east of the Site. To the west of the Site is parking and the remaining vacant Galleria Mall. Immediately to the south of the Site is the remaining portion of the vacant former Macy's Department Store, which now has its own Condominium Lot and is a separate BCP Site #C360258 known as 50 Court Street since it is being separately remediated and redeveloped, and beyond that is the Westchester County Office Building and Surrogate's Courthouse.

B. Site Features

The Site is currently occupied by a portion of the former Galleria Mall Macy's building, which is vacant. The building became vacant around March 2023 when the Department store and the entirety of the former Mall closed. The building is occasionally used by Homeland Security and local Police for active shooter practice, but they are not a tenant, and the building is otherwise vacant. The closest water body, the Bronx River, is located approximately 0.35 miles from the Site. The Site is not located in a Flood Zone and is in an area of a minimal flood hazard. See Exhibit D, Flood Map.

C. Current Zoning and Land Use

The Site is currently located in the B-6 (Enclosed Mall) District. See Exhibit E, Zoning Map. The Site is currently vacant other than for occasional law enforcement shooter training. The Site is bound to the north and east by commercial, residential and office buildings. The Site is bound to the south by the remainder of the vacant Macy's building and the Westchester County Office Building and Surrogate's Courthouse. To the west of the Site is the remainder of the Galleria Mall. The Site is located approximately 1,638 feet to the east of the White Plains Metro North Railroad Station and Rail-line. Therefore, the Site is a transit-oriented development Site. The Site is in the

middle of a rezoning effort to change the zoning to enable the planned mixed use residential/commercial project to proceed on the Site.

D. Past Use of the Site

See Section IV.4 for a full description of past land uses. Grand Street ran from north to south through the middle of the Site from the 1800s until at least the 1970s. From 1885 until 1950, the western portion of the Site contained some or all of the following historical uses: print shops, painting and oil shops, bottling works, plumbing and tin shops. The eastern half of the Site was developed in approximately 1885 and was occupied by the Westchester County Courthouse until approximately 1950. A hotel may also have been present on western portion of the Site as of 1894; a police station on the southwest portion of the Site as of 1905; and a fire department on the western side as of 1911. Subsequently, the Courthouse moved to an adjacent property, and by 1971 the former Courthouse building on this Site was demolished. In 1978, the White Plains Urban Renewal Agency acquired the Site, and the Galleria Mall started to be constructed that same year. Initially, an A&S Department Store occupied the Site from 1980-1996, and then it was converted to a Macy's Department Store in 1996, until the Site became vacant in 2023. Since 2023 it has occasionally been used by law enforcement for training purposes. The two stores used large heating oil tanks to heat the stores, which are still present but closed in place. The historical owners and operations associated with the Site are further described below and in Exhibit F, Previous Owners and Operators List.

E. Site Geology and Hydrogeology

Per the USDA National Cooperative Soil Survey map, the soil at the Site is characterized as Urban Land Outwash Substratum (UoA), which is urban land that is surface covered by pavement, concrete, buildings and other structures, and is underlain by disturbed and natural soil material and till substratum, with a 0 to 3 percent slope. The stratigraphy of the Site, from the surface down, consists of fill material to a depth of approximately 8 feet below grade surface (ft-bgs). Under the fill material is generally brown/gray coarse to find sand, some silt and little gravel to boring completion. Based upon the New York State geologic database, the overburden is underlain by the Inwood marble formation. Based on subsurface investigations on nearby properties, bedrock is anticipated to be encountered at depths ranging from 20 to 40 ft-bgs. According to a Remedial Investigation Report from an adjacent BCP Site (C360073) to the northeast of the Site, located at 221 Main Street, the elevation of groundwater at the Site is approximately 180-200 feet above mean sea level, and the groundwater is expected to follow the topography in the western direction.

F. Environmental Assessment

In soil, SVOCs were detected in significant exceedance of the Restricted Residential Soil Cleanup Objective (RRSCOs), including Benzo(a)anthracene (max of 31 mg/kg), Benzo(a)pyrene (max of 28 mg/kg), Benzo(b)fluoranthene (max of 35 mg/kg), Benzo(k)fluoranthene (max of 11 mg/kg) Chrysene (max of 27 mg/kg), Dibenzo(a,h)anthracene (max of 4 mg/kg) and Indeno(1,2,3-cd)pyrene (max of 14 mg/kg). The heavy metal Lead (max of 752 mg/kg), was also detected on the Site in exceedance of its RRSCO. SVOCs, a VOC and Metals were detected in soil in exceedance of the Protection of Groundwater Soil Cleanup Standards (POGW SCOs). The VOC

detected in exceedance of the POGW SCOs was Acetone. The SVOCs detected in exceedance of the POGW SCOs include Benzo(a)anthracene, Benzo(a)pyrene, Benzo(b)fluoranthene, Benzo(k)fluoranthene, Chrysene, and Indeno(1,2,3-cd)pyrene. The metal detected in exceedance of the POGW SCOs was Lead.

In groundwater, one VOC, SVOCs, Pesticides, PFAS and Metals were detected in exceedance of the Ambient Water Quality Standards (AWQS). The VOC Chloroform (max of 12 μ g/L), was detected in exceedance of the AWQS. The SVOCs that exceed their respective AWQS include Benzo(a)anthracene (max of 1.3 μ g/L), Benzo(a)pyrene (max of 1.5 μ g/L), Benzo(b)fluoranthene (max of 1.7 μ g/L), Benzo(k)fluoranthene (max of 0.59 μ g/L), Chrysene (max of 2.3 μ g/L), Hexachlorobenzene (max of 0.04 μ g/L) and Indeno(1,2,3-cd)pyrene (max of 0.9 μ g/L). The Pesticides that exceed their respective AWQS include Chlordane (max of 0.177 μ g/L) and Dieldrin (max of 0.013 μ g/L). The PFAS compounds that exceed their respective AWQS include Perfluorooctanesulfonic Acid (PFOS) (max of 8.16 μ g/L) and Perfluorooctanoic Acid (PFOA) (max of 121 μ g/L). The Metals that exceed their respective AWQS include Antimony (max of 5.5 μ g/L), Barium (max of 1833 μ g/L), Beryllium (max of 3.46 μ g/L), Chromium (max of 303.3 μ g/L), Copper (max of 579.8 μ g/L), Iron (max of 154000 μ g/L), Lead (max of 258.3 μ g/L), Magnesium (max of 201000 μ g/L), Manganese (max of 4715 μ g/L), Nickel (max of 246.9 μ g/L), Selenium (max of 37.9 μ g/L) and Sodium (max of 1020000 μ g/L).

In soil vapor (SV) and indoor air (IA), VOCs were detected within one sample of each collected from the Site. The following were detected in both SV and IA: Acetone (2-Propanone) (SV – 79.6 $\mu g/m^3$ and IA – 4.5 $\mu g/m^3$), Benzene (SV – 2.5 $\mu g/m^3$ and IA – 1.3 $\mu g/m^3$), Dichlorodifluoromethane $(SV - 39 \mu g/m^3)$ and $IA - 2.4 \mu g/m^3$), Ethanol $(SV - 21.1 \mu g/m^3)$ and $IA - 14 \mu g/m^3)$, Ethylbezene $(SV - 2.4 \mu g/m^3)$ and $IA - 0.78 \mu g/m^3$, Heptane $(SV - 7.4 \mu g/m^3)$ and $IA - 0.49 \mu g/m^3$, Hexane $(SV - 1.4 \mu g/m^3)$ $-9.9 \mu g/m^3$ and IA $-0.67 \mu g/m^3$), Isopropyl Alcohol (SV $-42.5 \mu g/m^3$ and IA $-5.2 \mu g/m^3$), Methylene Chloride (SV – 17 μ g/m³ and IA – 0.69 μ g/m³), Methyl Ethyl Ketone (SV – 11 μ g/m³ and IA $-0.35 \text{ }\mu\text{g/m}^3$), 2.2.4-Trimethylpentane (SV $-2.4 \text{ }\mu\text{g/m}^3$ and IA $-0.93 \text{ }\mu\text{g/m}^3$), Tetrachloroethylene (SV – 14 μ g/m³ and IA – 0.75 μ g/m³), Toluene (SV – 21 μ g/m³ and IA – 2.3 $\mu g/m^3$), m,p-Xylene (SV – 5.6 $\mu g/m^3$ and IA – 2.2 $\mu g/m^3$), o-Xylenes (SV – 1.9 $\mu g/m^3$ and IA – 0.83 $\mu g/m^3$) and Xylenes (total) (SV – 7.4 $\mu g/m^3$ and IA – 3 $\mu g/m^3$). The following were detected in only SV: Carbon Disulfide (38.3 μg/m³), 1,1-Dichloroethane (20 μg/m³), 1,1-Dichloroethylene (6.7 $\mu g/m^3$), 1,4-Dioxane (19 $\mu g/m^3$), Ethyl Acetate (4 $\mu g/m^3$), Methyl Isobutyl Ketone (4.5 $\mu g/m^3$), 1,1,1-Trichloroethane (195 µg/m³) and Tertiary Butyl Alcohol (8.5 µg/m³). The following were detected in only IA: Chloromethane (1 µg/m³), Carbon Tetrachloride (0.52 µg/m³), 1,2,4-Trimethylbenzene (0.59 $\mu g/m^3$), Trichlorofluoromethane (1.5 $\mu g/m^3$) and Propylene (2.6 $\mu g/m^3$).

SECTION II: PROJECT DESCRIPTION

1-3. Please refer to the BCP Application Form.

4. Short Project Description

The planned redevelopment of the Site entails the construction of a 505 unit apartment building with either 12% affordable units for 60%-80% Area Median Income (AMI) at a 60% threshold or 8% affordable units for 40% AMI, a 40,000 square foot retail component on the ground floor and several levels of parking under the building to accommodate approximately 300-400 vehicles. Privately owned publicly accessible open space will also be created as a part of the project. The project is in close proximity to the Metro North train station and will result in a transit oriented mixed use walkable community building.

<u>Schedule – Commencement through COC</u>

A Remedial Investigation ("RI") Work Plan ("RIWP") has been submitted with the BCP Application. In order to complete the investigation the building has to be demolished in order to remove the two large 10,000 gallon tanks. The Remedial Investigation is expected to be completed on the Site shortly after the Site has been accepted into the program in January 2026. Site preparation activities, including demolition and tank removal are expected to commence thereafter in Spring 2026 as well; specifically, demolition from approximately from February to April 2026. The Remedial Investigation Report ("RIR") will be submitted by March - April 2026. The Remedial Action Work Plan ("RAWP") will be submitted around the same time. The RAWP Approval and a Decision Document is anticipated to be issued June 2026, and the RAWP will be implemented from June to September 2026. A Site Management Plan ("SMP") and Final Engineering Report ("FER") will be submitted in October 2026. The Certificate of Completion is anticipated to be issued on or before December 31, 2026.

5. Green and Sustainable Remediation (GSR)

GRS principles will be incorporated into each step of the BCP Process:

Remedial Investigation/Alternatives Analysis: GSR will be incorporated into RI project planning, including the application of the proposed environmental footprint analysis tool, and how climate resiliency will be included. A discussion about the plan to implement GSR will be included in the RIWP and implemented during the RI. Specifically during the RI implementation, the consultant will:

- Evaluate sensitive, local human and ecological receptors which require protection from contaminants of concern, traffic, noise, dust and odors during the implementation. An enhanced Community Air Monitoring Plan will be implemented.
- Identify vendors with operation centers local to the Site to minimize fuel consumption associated with travel to and from the Site and encourage use of the Metro North Train Station located approximately 0.30 miles from the Site.
- Salvage organic debris that is uncontaminated and free of pests or disease, for use as supplemental infill, mulch or compost.
- Salvage uncontaminated objects with potential recycle, resale, donation or onsite infrastructure value, such as steel, concrete and granite.
- Designate collection points for recycling single-use items such as metal, plastic and glass containers; paper and cardboard; and other consumable items.

• Advise contractors to avoid idling vehicles while on the BCP Site and to use mass transit near the Site for access to the Site.

<u>Remedial Design and Remedial Action:</u> Green remediation principles and techniques will be implemented to the extent feasible in the design and implementation of the remedy as per DER-31. The major green remediation components are as follows:

- Considering the environmental impacts of treatment technologies and remedy stewardship over the long term and specify chemicals or agents, where applicable, that are not harmful or hazardous to aquatic environments and the subsurface, are readily biodegradable, and/or can help to improve site geochemical conditions;
- Reducing direct and indirect greenhouse gases and other emissions;
- Increasing energy efficiency and minimizing use of non-renewable energy;
- Conserving and efficiently managing resources and materials;
- Reducing waste, increasing recycling and increasing reuse of materials which would otherwise be considered a waste;
- Maximizing habitat value and creating green space when possible;
- Fostering green and healthy communities and working landscapes which balance ecological, economic and social goals;
- Integrating the remedy with the end use where possible and encouraging green and sustainable re-development; and
- Additionally, to incorporate green remediation principles and techniques to the extent feasible in the future development at this Site, including that any future on-site buildings shall be constructed, at a minimum, to meet the 2020 Energy Conservation Construction Code of New York (or most recent edition) to improve energy efficiency as an element of construction.

An environmental footprint analysis will be completed, which will use an accepted environmental footprint analysis calculator such as SEFA (Spreadsheets for Environmental Footprint Analysis, USEPA), SiteWiseTM (available in the Sustainable Remediation Forum [SURF] library) or similar Department accepted tool and construction considerations should reference NYSDEC standard specification 01 89 29-Green Remediation Practice and the associated Form A – Summary of Green Remediation Metrics will be used to track actual metrics for the footprint analysis. Contractors will also pay attention to the carbon emissions used in the material generation and transportation to reduce the carbon footprint and recycling applicability where possible. This extends to the use of drilling fluids that are biodegradable and chemicals that are not harmful or hazardous during site operations. Contractors will reference the ISS Factsheet provided by the NYSDEC when selecting materials, methods and general operations for this work if required at the Site.

Water consumption, greenhouse gas emissions, renewable and non-renewable energy use, waste reduction and material use will be estimated, and goals for the project related to these green and sustainable remediation metrics, as well as for minimizing community impacts, protecting habitats and natural and cultural resources, and promoting environmental justice, will be incorporated into the remedial design program, as appropriate. The project design specifications will include detailed requirements to achieve the green and sustainable remediation goals. Further, progress with respect

to green and sustainable remediation metrics will be tracked during implementation of the remedial action and reported in the Final Engineering Report (FER), including a comparison to the goals established during the remedial design program.

<u>Site Management:</u> GSR will be incorporated into Site Management, including use of DEC's SMP template, resource and energy consumption reduction, waste minimization, and climate resiliency evaluation within Periodic Review Reports (PRRs). Further, progress with respect to green and sustainable remediation metrics will be tracked, and reported in PRRs, as part of the Site Management program, and opportunities to further reduce the environmental footprint of the project will be identified as appropriate.

<u>Redevelopment:</u> The new on-Site building will implement green stormwater management practices, evaluate the use of geothermal heating and cooling for project, with the goal of designing buildings to a LEED Silver standard. The building will also meet one of the following criteria:

- 1. Energy Star Multifamily New Construction Program
- 2. ICC/ASHRAE 700 2020 National Green Building Standard Silver or higher

The Project is also a transit-oriented development project since the new apartment complex is located approximately 0.30 miles, which is walking distance, to the White Plains Metro North train station.

6. Climate Change Screening or Vulnerability Assessment

The Site is entering the program at the investigation Stage, therefore, a Climate Change Screening or Vulnerability Assessment is not required at this time. The remedial design program will include a climate change vulnerability assessment, to evaluate the impact of climate change on the Site and the proposed remedy. Potential vulnerabilities associated with extreme weather events (e.g., hurricanes, lightning, heat stress and drought), flooding, and sea level rise will be identified, and the remedial design program will incorporate measures to minimize the impact of climate change on potential identified vulnerabilities. The closest body of water to the Site is the Bronx River, which is approximately 0.35 miles from the Site. The Site is not located in a flood zone. See Exhibit D – Flood Map.

SECTION III: ECOLOGICAL CONCERNS

4. Fish and Wildlife Resources Impact Analysis Part I (FWRIA Part I).

The Bronx River is 0.35 miles from the Site. However, a Fish & Wildlife assessment is not anticipated for this Site due to its urban location and distance from surface water bodies and wildlife areas, as well as the unlikelihood that the type of contamination found to date on this Site could migrate and impact the nearest water body. The Site is also not in a Flood Zone. See Exhibit D. A Fish & Wildlife assessment confirming these facts will be included in the Remedial Investigation Report.

SECTION IV: LAND USE FACTORS

1. Current Zoning

The Site is within the B-6 (Enclosed Mall) District. See Exhibit E, Zoning Map.

2. Allowed Uses

The B-6 Zoning District, or "Enclosed Mall," allows for various permitted principal uses and special uses such as recreation, semi-public, community facilities, office, business, and parking. The Site is being rezoned as part of a newly proposed Transit Development 2 (TD-2) District. Since the mall closed, the City of White Plains is facilitating this rezoning to allow for multifamily residential and other uses generally similar to the existing Transit Development 1 (TD-1) District, in support of the City's goal to increase available housing units and to reuse the land on the underutilized closed mall land. The development plan for the proposed project on the Site has been analyzed in a Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS). Approval for the rezoning anticipated to be approved by the City of White Plains is expected by the end of this calendar year.

3-4. Current Use

This Site is currently vacant and has been vacant since Macy's closed in March 2023. The building is occasionally used by homeland security and police for active shooter practice.

5. Intended Use Post Remediation

After the remediation, the Site will be used for a mixed use residential and commercial project, with a certain percentage of the apartments being slated as affordable housing. See more detailed project description in Section II.4 above.

6. Post Remediation Use

After the remediation, the Site will be used for a mixed use residential and commercial project, with a certain percentage of the apartments being slated as affordable housing. See more detailed project description in Section II.4 above.

7. Renewable Energy Facility

The proposed post-remediation use is not a renewable energy facility.

8. Do current historical and/or recent development patterns support the proposed use?

Yes, current, historical and/or recent development patterns support the proposed use since more transit-oriented residential development is needed in White Plains and is consistent with the City's rezoning efforts for the enclosed mall. Moreover, having additional affordable housing units is consistent with local planning efforts and will enhance affordable living in this City at this location which is near the train station, and in both an En-Zone and disadvantaged community.

9. Is the proposed use consistent with applicable zoning laws/maps?

No, the project is not consistent with the current Zoning Ordinance of the City of White Plains since the current zoning of the Site is B-6 (Enclosed Mall). However, as noted above, the City of White Plains is currently engaged in a rezoning effort to amendment the Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map. The rezoning effort underway entails the creation of a new Transit Development 2 District (TD-2). The proposed TD-2 District is consistent with the City's goal to create a more mixed-use, walkable community on the Site. The proposed TD-2 District complements the Transit Development 1 (TD-1) District recently created for the nearby Hamilton Green redevelopment project and would further the City's goals of transit-oriented development in proximity to the White Plains Metro-North Station. The Requestor projects having the City's rezoning approval by the end of the year.

10. Consistent with the Master Plan?

Yes, the project is consistent with the City's Master Plan, which allows for multi-family residential buildings and commercial buildings near the Metro North train Station to enhance transit oriented residential living.

4. Past Land Use

1. Past Use of the Site

The according to the Sanborn fire insurance maps, Grand Street ran through the middle of the Site from the 1800s until at least the 1970s. From 1885 until 1950, the western portion of the Site contained some or all of the following historical uses: print shops, painting and oil shops, bottling

works, plumbing and tin shops. The eastern half of the Site was developed in approximately 1885 and was occupied by the Westchester County Courthouse until approximately 1950. In 1893, a building was added to the western side of the Court House and was utilized as the Hall of Records. A hotel may also have been present on western portion of the Site as of 1894; a police station on the southwest portion of the Site as of 1905; and a fire department on the western side as of 1911. In 1916, a fireproof building was added to the Westchester County Courthouse to the north of the original building. The Site remained mostly unchanged until 1950.

Subsequently to 1950, the Courthouse moved to an adjacent property, and by 1971 the former Courthouse building on this Site was demolished. In 1978, the White Plains Urban Renewal Agency acquired the Site, and the Galleria Mall started to be constructed that same year. The current Galleria Mall building was constructed on the Site between 1979 and 1980. The portion of the Galleria Mall building located on the Site was then utilized as an Abraham & Straus, and then a Stern's Department Store, until 1996. In 1996, Macy's Department Store opened until the store later closed in March 2023. The building is still present on the Site and is vacant, except for occasional use by homeland security and police for active shooter training per a license agreement, which can be canceled by the owner at any time. All the prior buildings appeared to be heated with heating oil and housed large oil tanks.

2. <u>Past Investigations Related to Uses and Environmental Conditions that Led to the Submission of this Application.</u>

In April 2019, ATC Group Services LLC completed a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment (ESA) for the entire former tax lot #125.75-4-4, which included the Site and the remainder of the property that was occupied by the Macy's store. A number of spills were noted in the 2019 Phase I Report. Two spills were reported to the NYSDEC in 1988 and were identified as Spill Numbers 8803673 and 8805571. Both of these spills appear to be related to tank test failures associated with a 10,000-gallon Underground Storage Tank ("UST"), which according to the 2019 Phase I ESA was re-lined and put back in service following the closure of the spill cases with the NYSDEC. Four oil fill ports were observed on the Site, two located on the sidewalk along Main Street, directly in front of the loading dock and two within the loading dock area. Please see Exhibit I – REC Location Map.

According to a Fuel Oil Tank Upgrade Project Report, prepared by Clayton Environmental Services, Inc., which has been included with this application, two 10,000-gallon USTs were installed on the Site in 1979 on a concrete pad below the loading dock area and were closed in place in January 1997. The four oil fill ports are likely associated with the two USTs. An Aboveground Storage Tank ("AST") was also observed on the Site located within the eastern portion of the loading dock area. The AST was reportedly installed in 1997. The purpose of the 1,000-gallon diesel AST was to transfer fuel to a 100-gallon day AST and emergency generator. The emergency generated is located within the penthouse generator room of the property building and oil staining was observed on the concrete pad below the generator's engine. A passenger elevator located on the Site had minor staining in the vicinity of the equipment and a slight petroleum like sheen on standing water within the loading dock area was observed. Nevertheless, these observations were considered de minimis conditions by the consultant. A screening survey for readily observable mold and conditions conductive to mold was also conducted on the property.

It was noted that there were various areas of water-stained ceiling tiles and visible mold growth throughout the building.

In August 2025, SESI Consulting Engineers ("SESI") prepared a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment for Requestor. This Phase I listed the above-mentioned USTs as recognized environmental conditions (RECs) and provided that the USTs were registered with PBS number 3-492205. This Phase I also listed the above-mentioned spills, identified as Spill Numbers 8803673 and 8805571, as Controlled Recognized Environmental Conditions ("CRECs") and recognized multiple Business Environmental Risks ("BERs"). The BERs included: (1) the above-mentioned AST; (2) potential Polychlorinated Biphenyl (PCB) Caulk throughout the building; (3) potential asbestos-containing materials; and (4) potential lead-based paint. Several pieces of universal waste were identified on the property causing SESI to recommend a universal waste survey prior to demolition. Finally, since historic operations contained petroleum and volatile organic compound uses, which may have contributed to soil and groundwater vapor, SESI also recommended a vapor intrusion evaluation as part of the redevelopment process.

In September 2025, SESI completed a Phase II ESA Report. This investigation included collecting soil samples from 5 to 20 feet-below grade surface (ft-bgs), three groundwater samples, one soil vapor sample and one indoor air vapor sample. The soil samples showed SVOCs levels exceeding their respective RRSCOs throughout the Site from 1-7 ft-bgs and one high lead RRSCO exceedance. The stratigraphy of the Site consists of fill material below the surface to about 8 ft-bgs, then an underlay of brown/gray coarse to fine sand, some silt and little gravel. Groundwater was encountered between 20-23 ft-bgs on the east. The groundwater samples showed consistent concentrations of various SVOCs, VOCs, PFAS compounds, metals and pesticides exceeding their respective AWQS throughout the Site. The soil vapor samples revealed a number of petroleum hydrocarbon and chlorinated VOCs that were detected in the soil vapor and indoor air sample. One of the chlorinated VOCs exceeded its respective NYSDOH subslab decision matrix screening level. SESI concluded that the exceedances in soil, groundwater, and soil vapor reported during the investigation are likely the result of the Site's historical land uses, including the USTs, and the presence of contaminated historic fill.

In September 2025, SESI also prepared a Remedial Investigation Work Plan (RIWP) for the Requestor to accompany this application. Since the investigation cannot be completed until the two large 10,000 gallon tanks are removed from under the building, the RIWP includes building demolition and tank removal to complete the investigation under the tanks and Site-wide.

SECTION VII: REQUESTOR INFORMATION

The Requestor is Main-Court Partners LLC, a New York limited liability company, located at 160 Hillair Circle, White Plains, NY 10605. Main-Court Partners LLC is authorized to do business in the State of New York. See Exhibit J, NYSDOS Entity Information. The sole member is Bruce Berg. The Sole Member Written Consent provides Bruce Berg with authority to sign all Brownfield Cleanup Program ("BCP") documents on behalf of the Requestor Main-Court Partners LLC. See Exhibit K – Sole Member Written Consent.

Requestor is not the owner of the site. As more fully described below in Section IX, Galleria City Holding Company LLC is the current owner of the Site. See Exhibit G Deed. The Requestor has received a temporary license from the Owner to access the property to perform investigation and remediation work required by the BCP. See Exhibit H - Site Access Agreement.

The Requestor has no prior relationship with any current or past owners or operators of the Site. See Exhibit F - Previous Owners and Operators List. The Requestor did not cause any of the contamination of the Site, which predates the Requestor's involvement at the Site.

11. Unregistered Bulk Storage Tanks

There are no Unregistered Bulk Storage Tanks located on the Site. The two large 10,000-gallon tanks that are still located on the Site are registered and closed in place. The remaining 1,000 gallon AST at the loading dock area and the 100 gallon AST in the penthouse are collectively under the more than 1,101 gallons required for registration.

REQUESTOR VOLUNTEER CERTIFICATION

The Requestor certifies that it is a Volunteer, since it does not have nor has ever had a relationship with any of the past owners or operators of the Site that caused the contamination other than the plan to purchase the Site from the current owner. Requestor did not have any involvement with the Site at the time of disposal. The Requestor has performed all required environmental due diligence prior to acquiring the Site and has implemented due care of the Site to the extent it has accessed the Site for due diligence purposes.

SECTION XI: PROPERTY ELIGIBILITY INFORMATION

Please refer to the responses to the Questions 1-6 on the BCP Application Form, which confirms the site is not ineligible for the BCP.

In addition to the responses on the application form, which clarify the Site is an eligible brownfield site pursuant to ECL § 27-1405, the following information further demonstrates this Site's eligibility for the BCP.

The Site meets the definition of an eligible "brownfield site" in Environmental Conservation Law § 27-1405(2) as "any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by the department that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations." Environmental investigation results show evidence of impact from the Site's previous commercial and industrial uses, which can be linked to and caused Site contamination above the applicable cleanup standards. See Environmental Reports separately attached and the Spider Maps in Exhibit I, providing the data demonstrating exceedances of the cleanup standards for this Site. As a result, the Site meets the definition of a brownfield site pursuant to Environmental Conservation Law §27-1405(2).

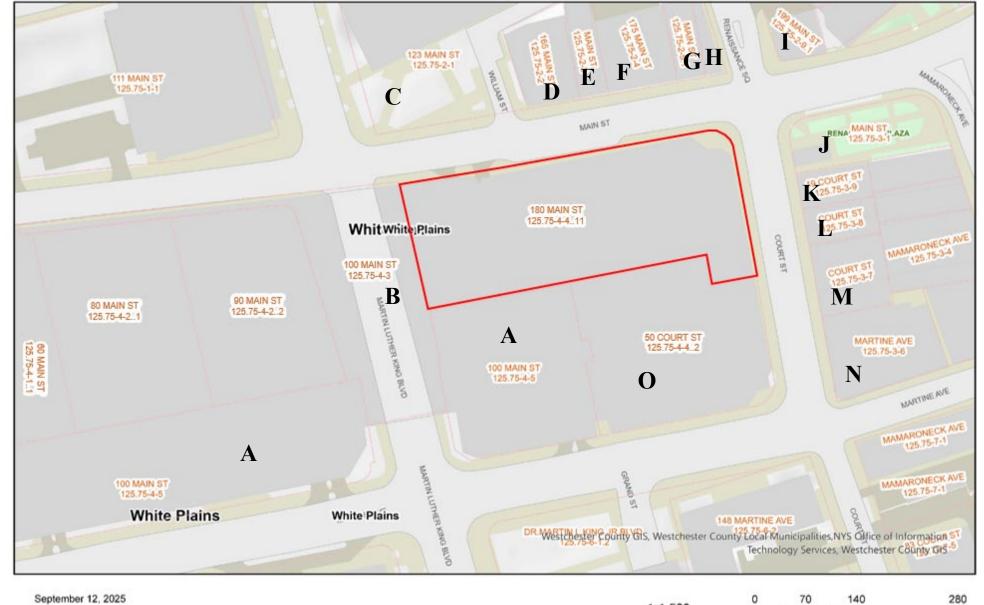

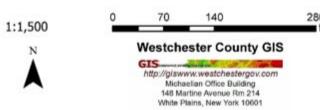

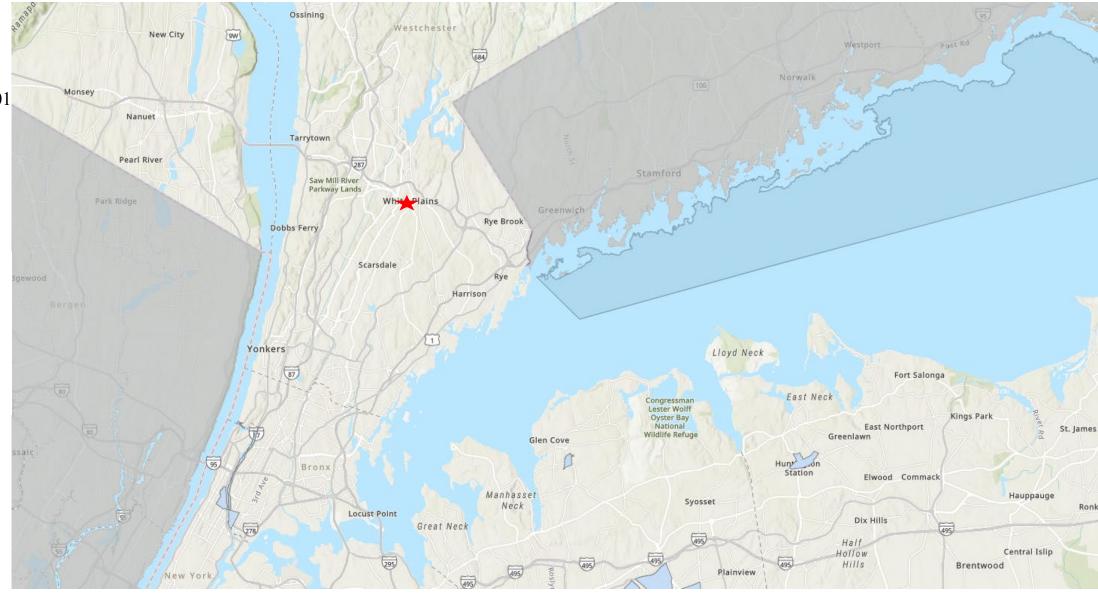
