Cleanup Action Completed at Brownfield Site

Action has been completed to address the contamination related to the Hamilton Hill II – Target Area 1 Site ("site") located at 830 and 834 Albany Street, Schenectady, Schenectady County under New York State's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP). Please see the map below for the site location.

Cleanup activities were performed by Hamilton Hill II Limited Partnership ("applicant") with oversight provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). The applicant has submitted a draft Final Engineering Report (FER) for NYSDEC review which states that cleanup requirements have been or will be achieved to fully protect public health and the environment for the proposed site use.

Highlights of the Site Cleanup: The following activities have been or shortly will be completed to achieve the remedial action objectives:

- Removal of two aboveground and two underground storage tanks and a discarded furnace boiler.
- Excavation and off-site disposal of 10,040.59 tons of contaminated soil • and historic fill material exceeding the Unrestricted Use soil cleanup objectives (SCOs), the site-specific cleanup criteria.
- Collection and analysis of end-point samples to document the • effectiveness of the remedy.
- Importation of clean fill to replace the excavated soil and to establish • the design grades at the site.
- Decommissioning of the groundwater monitoring wells installed at the site.
- Recording of an Environmental Easement restricting the use of • groundwater from the site.

Next Steps: When NYSDEC approves the FER, it will be made available to the public (see "Where to Find Information"). NYSDEC then will issue a Certificate of Completion (COC) that will be announced in a fact sheet. The applicant would be able to redevelop the site after receiving a COC. In

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addition, the applicant will be eligible for tax credits to offset a portion of the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site.

A COC may be modified or revoked if, for example, an applicant does not comply with the terms of its Brownfield Cleanup Agreement with NYSDEC.

Site Description: The 0.81-acre site is in the Hamilton Hill neighborhood in the City of Schenectady, Schenectady County. The site consists of two noncontiguous parcels that were recently formed by merging 10 tax lots. The site parcels, referred to as 830 Albany Street and 834 Albany Street, are located to the southwest and southeast (respectively) of the intersection of Albany Street and Craig Street. The parcels previously contained residential and commercial structures, including a dry cleaner, which were demolished in 2019. The surrounding area is mixed use residential and commercial. The site is currently being redeveloped into affordable multi-family housing.

York's Brownfield Cleanup **Program:** New Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other healthbased or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by NYSDEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.


