The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (Department) is in receipt of your application for participation in the Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) pursuant to ECL Section 27-1400 et seq. As you know, the BCP is a cooperative approach between the Department and lenders, developers, and current and prospective owners. The program fosters private-sector remediation of brownfields and reduces development pressures on "greenfields." We are pleased to advise you that your application has been determined to be complete.

Pursuant to ECL Section 27-1407(5), a 30 day public comment period is to be commenced upon the Department's determination that an application is complete. During the comment period the Department will be evaluating the eligibility of the project and determine the status regarding this as soon as possible. The party seeking to participate in the BCP is required under the BCP to notify in writing the chief executive officer and zoning board of each county, city, town and village in which the proposed brownfield site is located, as well as residents of the site, the public water supplier which services the area, any person who has requested to be placed on the brownfield site contact list, and the administrator of any school or day care facility located adjacent to or near the site. Further, the Department will publish a similar notice in the Environmental Notice Bulletin.

In order to facilitate the notifications, the Department has prepared the enclosed Public Notice for you to utilize and the instructions for placing and mailing the notifications as well as the document repository location and contents. As the applicant you are responsible for making available a copy of the application and copies of all other related attached documents such as any assessment and investigation reports and/or investigation or remedial work plans. Also, you must use this Department-approved Public Notice form and cannot provide any other or additional information when fulfilling your obligation to provide a legal notice for the newspaper of the application and comment period. The enclosed form should be provided to a local newspaper servicing the area including the brownfield site for publication no later than March 23, 2005. Additionally, all of the above-mentioned mailings should be completed no later than March 22, 2005. To the extent that the mailings and publications are not

completed in accordance with these time frames, the Department will extend the comment period for a period sufficient to comply with the required thirty day notice requirement running from the latest of the mailings or publication.

A certificate of mailing, on the enclosed form, is required to be submitted within three days of the mailing. Further, the proof of publication provided by the newspaper must be submitted within three days of your receipt of such document. These documents should be submitted to the Department's project manager at:

The Department will make every effort to determine your eligibility and status under the BCP forty-five days from the date of this letter. "SITE" DESCRIPTION

ITEM 1: SITE ADDRESSES AND CURRENT/FORMER USES

The "Back Lot" or Site" that will be the subject of this application is made up of approximately 3 acres in the City of Rochester, Monroe County, New York. The Site is bounded to the west by the Volunteers of America (VOA) Human Service Complex, which includes VOA's administrative offices, a VOA thrift store and a day care center that serves the local community, to the north by a Monroe County right-of-way to the Purewaters Tunnel Structure 41, to the east by the former RAE Oil Company facility and to the south by Ambrose Street. The Site is essentially a vacant lot used for parking and a roadway to access the rear of the VOA Complex.

The address of the Site is 214 Lake Avenue, Rochester, New York 14614. This address includes not only the Back Lot Site in question for this application (the eastern portion of the property) but also the western portion of the property which houses the VOA Human Service Complex discussed above. Prior to the submission of this application to the NYSDEC, the western portion of the property, which houses the VOA Human Service Complex, was the subject of a significant remediation project. On April 23, 2002, at the conclusion of that remediation effort by VOA, the NYSDEC issued a Spill Closure Letter indicating that the remediation of the western portion of the site was completed, and as such, no further action was required. A copy of the letter is attached as Exhibit A. Because of this "no further action letter" the Site proposed for this application only includes the uninvestigated and unremediated eastern back portion of 214 Lake Avenue.

See Exhibit B, including Tax Map and figures attached to the July 2, 2004 Remedial Investigation Work Plan prepared by GeoQuest Environmental Inc.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

ITEM 2: PURPOSE AND SCOPE OF THE PROJECT

Currently, the forecasted final use of the VOA site will be to house a storage warehouse. VOA is a not-for-profit charitable organization that accepts donations of items such as clothing, toys and household items. VOA also accepts donations of larger items such as household appliances (i.e. refrigerators, stoves, washer/dryers) and automobiles. VOA hopes to eventually raise enough money to construct a warehouse on the Site, which could house these larger donations under their Vehicle Donation Program and subsequently be sold in

one of their many local retail centers. There is no projected financial information regarding the final use of the site since VOA currently does not have the funding to construct this facility.

With the creation of the new Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP), and elimination of the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP), VOA has elected to work through the only available process for investigating and remediating a site of this nature. As a not-for-profit organization, VOA is not currently eligible for any of the tax credits offered by the BCP and is primarily seeking the liability limitation that comes with the successful completion of a project under this program.

The City of Rochester is in favor of this project. In fact, the City has submitted to the State a Brownfields Opportunity Area, Lyell-Lake-State Street Corridor Pre-Nomination Study Grant application, which includes this Site. Therefore, this project is consistent with the City's comprehensive plan for this portion of the City.

ITEM 3: ESTIMATED PROJECT SCHEDULE

Attached is a copy of a proposed Remedial Investigation Work Plan (RIWP) for the Site, which is scheduled to take approximately 18 weeks. The work proposed in the Remedial Investigation Work Plan will begin as soon as the Brownfield Cleanup Program Application for the Site is approved, the Brownfield Cleanup Agreement (BCA) is signed and the Department approves the Scope of Work in the RIWP. These initial approval steps in the program are statutorily scheduled to take approximately 2 to 2 ½ months. Therefore, investigation work on the Site should begin in approximately mid-April of 2005.

ITEM 4: ENVIRONMENTAL DATA

Three environmental studies have been performed on the Site and are attached hereto. The goal of the proposed additional investigation work is to meet the site investigation requirements of ECL Title 14 Section 27-1415(2) by filling in all remaining data gaps. The previous reports include:

- 1. MRB Phase I Environmental Site Assessment, December 28, 1992: This report summarizes an investigation into any known or potential items of noncompliance with applicable local, state or federal law as well as the apparent presence or absence of potential environmental concerns. This report concludes, among other things, that the former coal storage area on the eastern portion of the subject property (the portion that is the subject of this application) may contain poly-aromatic hydrocarbons, which break down into tar substances.
- 2. GZA Phase II Environmental Site Assessment, June 1996: This report summarizes an assessment of the Site, which included subsurface borings,

installation of groundwater monitoring wells, groundwater level measurements, and collection and analysis of soil and groundwater samples. This report concludes that VOC and metals compounds were detected in soil samples at levels exceeding NYSDEC TAGM 4046 guidelines; metals were detected in groundwater samples at concentrations exceeding Class GA guidelines; and a heavy weight petroleum hydrocarbon identified as "Lube Oil" was detected in soil samples.

3. GZA Supplemental Phase II Site Assessment, January 1997: This report summarizes an assessment of the Site, which included subsurface borings and collection and analysis of soil and groundwater samples. This report concludes that SVOC's were detected in soil samples at levels exceeding NYSDEC TAGM 4046 standards; and that RCRA 8 Metals were detected in soil samples at levels exceeding Site cleanup guidelines and/or site background levels.

ITEM 5: OWNERS AND OPERATORS

A list of previous owners and operators was essentially included in the June 1996 Phase II Report beginning on page 3, and has been summarized below:

According to Sanborn maps:

- 1892 Many residential structures are apparent on the Site.
- 1911 Similar to the 1892 map, with more residential structures.
- 1950 The Rochester Gas & Electric Pipe yard is present on the Site. Areas identified as "coal piles" are located on the site.
- 1971 Coal piles and barrel storage is present on the site.

In addition to this information, a company named Kaplan Container was present on a portion of the Site, and the former Heinrich Chevrolet and subsequent Bill Gordon car dealerships (which occupied the buildings on the western portion of the 214 Lake Avenue real estate parcel) parked cars on the Site.

ITEM 7: LAND USE FACTORS

1. Do current historical and/or recent development patterns support the proposed use?

Yes. The City of Rochester supports this project. The applicant believes the current historical and/or recent development patterns in the City of Rochester support the proposed use. Enhancement of the downtown area is specifically being encouraged by the City as evidenced by the Brownfields Opportunity Area, LYLAKS Pre-Nomination Study Grant application submitted by the City.

2. Is the proposed use consistent with applicable zoning laws/maps?

Yes. The Site is currently zoned for commercial and industrial uses.

3. Is the proposed use consistent with applicable brownfield opportunity area designations?

Yes. The proposed Site and use is consistent with the applicable brownfield opportunity area ("BOA") designated 970-r because the Site is located in an area of former industrial properties, is located within one of the State's new Environmental Zones, and is part of the Brownfields Opportunity Area, LYLAKS Pre-Nomination Study Grant application submitted by the City of Rochester.

4. Is the proposed use consistent with applicable comprehensive community master plans, local waterfront revitalization plans, other adopted land use plans?

Yes. The City of Rochester has always been interested in revitalizing the area in which the Site is located. The VOA Complex significantly revitalized this portion of Lake Avenue. In addition, the project is consistent with the City Renaissance 2010 Comprehensive Plan, which establishes environmental stewardship goals and strategies that guide land use and redevelopment decisions.

5. Are there any Environmental Justice Concerns (See §27-1415(3)(p)).

There are no Environmental Justice Concerns pursuant to §27-1415(3)(p). The Site is located in a low income high poverty area, which is the reason VOA is present at this location. However, VOA has no intention of creating a future industrial use that would create environmental justice concerns.

6-10. Are answered as "yes" or "no" on the application form itself.

11. Are there important federal, state or local natural resources, including waterways, wildlife refuges, wetlands or critical habitats of endangered or threatened species proximate to the site?

Yes. To the east of the Site, but not adjacent to the Site, is the Genesee River which flows directly into Lake Ontario.

12. Are there flood plains proximate to the site?

No. The Site is located on a large bluff above the river.

13. Describe on attachment the proximity to real property currently used for residential use, and to urban, commercial, industrial, agricultural, and recreational areas.

There are principally urban, industrial and commercial uses in close proximity to the Site. There are no agricultural or recreational uses adjacent to this site. There are a few residential houses across Lake Avenue but not adjacent to this Site.

14. Describe on attachment the potential vulnerability of groundwater to contamination that might migrate from the site, including proximity to wellhead protection and groundwater recharge.

No active municipal water supply wells, wellhead protection or groundwater recharge areas are located on or near the subject property. The Purewaters Tunnel is adjacent to the Site in subsurface soils but VOA's understanding is that this is a storm water not drinking water tunnel. Therefore, there is little potential that groundwater from the Site could affect either municipal water supply wells or recharge areas. Groundwater contamination in overburden groundwater has already been found. Off-site ground water issues are outside the scope of this volunteer's responsibility pursuant to the BCP.


15. Describe on attachment the geography and geology of the site.

According to the environmental reports prepared to date, the overburden soils at the Site generally consist of fill soils, lacustrine deposits, and glacial till. The fill soils generally consist of coarse to fine sand, little gravel, trace silt and clay with various amounts of brick, glass, metal, wood, cinders, coal fragments and ash. The thickness of the fill deposit ranges from approximately 2 to 6 feet along the west end of the Site to approximately 18 to 19 feel along the east end of the Site.

The lacustrine deposit generally underlies the fill deposit and consists of course to fine sand with occasional silt and clay layers. The lacustrine deposit ranges in thickness from approximately 6 to 14 feet. The glacial till deposit generally underlies the lacustrine deposit. The glacial till generally consists of course to fine gravel, some silt, little clay or coarse to fine sand, some silt, and fine gravel.

The depth to the top of the bedrock varies from approximately 4 feet to greater than approximately 30 feet below the ground surface at the Site. The bedrock encountered is the Rochester Shale, which consists of weathered, light brown to gray shale. In general, the bedrock formations below the Site are part of the Clinton Group.

Groundwater on the Site flows in a northeasterly direction across the site towards the Genesee River.

(VOA) regarding the back lot on its otherwise fully remediated and redeveloped headquarters parcel located at 214 Lake Avenue, Rochester, New York (the Site), as well as a draft remedial investigation work plan (RI WP) to investigation this Site. However, the back lot requires additional investigation and possibly remediation work. The RI WP describing the work that will be performed to investigate the Site, is available for review at the NYSDEC Region 8 Office at the address below or in the Rochester Public Library. The comment period for written and oral comments expressing objection or opposition to the work plan will commence on February __, and close on March , 2005. However, the public is able to submit substantive comments to the Department at any time on the work being performed at the Site through the identification of any specific grounds which could lead the Department to impose changes to the work implementation. Based on these comments, the NYSDEC may require the Participant to change their work practices.

Public Announcement

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), working cooperatively with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), is currently providing an opportunity for the public to comment on a Brownfield Cleanup Program Application and draft Remedial Investigation Work Plan (RI WP) between February March ___, 2005 to further investigate contamination on the approximately 3 acre back lot of 214 Lake Avenue, Rochester, New York 14614 (the Site). A map showing the Site location is attached. Volunteers of America of Western New York, Inc. (Volunteer), has previously remediated and redeveloped the front lot of the 214 Lake Avenue site into a Headquarters office building, thrift store and day care center complex. Plans to commence the subsurface remedial investigation of the back lot are tentatively scheduled to begin in late April 2005 after the close of this public comment period and consideration of all comments received.

The Proposed Action: - The purpose of the upcoming Remedial work is to remove petroleum contamination in the parking lot area east of the on-site building. At the end of this IRM work, anticipated to be completed in approximately November 2004, the Volunteer must prepare a Final Interim Remedial Measures Engineering Report, summarizing the remedial work performed. In addition, the Participant must take confirmatory samples at the bottom of the excavation to insure that the remaining soil meets certain cleanup standards, and prepare a Final Remedial Investigation Report, summarizing all of the remedial investigation work performed in and around the perimeter of the property not being excavated. Once the NYSDEC, NYSDOH, and the public have a full opportunity to review both of these final reports, a determination will be made as to whether: (1) the nature and extent of contamination was fully defined on the Site; (2) there are any other areas requiring remediation, and (3) to insure that no contamination is emanating from this site into the neighborhood. This determination will be made after the conclusion of the respective public comment periods and once the NYSDEC and NYSDOH have approved the Final Reports after consideration of your comments.

Your Opportunity to Comment on the Proposed Work: The public can provide either the NYSDEC or the NYSDOH with comments during the implementation of the IRM Work. The full IRM WP describing the work to be performed is available for your review at the document repositories listed in the column to the left. Your comments are important and strongly encouraged.
