# Draft Investigation Work Plan for Brownfield Site Available for Public Comment

The public is invited to comment on a draft work plan being reviewed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) to investigate the Former Gleason's Nursery site ("site") located at 4774 and 4780 Sheridan Drive in the Town of Amherst, Erie County. Please see the map for the site location.

#### **Draft Investigation Work Plan**

The draft investigation work plan, called a "Remedial Investigation Work Plan," (RIWP) was submitted to NYSDEC under New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program. The investigation will be performed by 4748 Sheridan Drive LLC ("applicant") with oversight by NYSDEC and the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH).

#### **How to Comment**

NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the Draft RIWP for 30 days, from **September 24 through October 24, 2025.**

#### **Highlights of the Proposed Site Investigation**

The investigation will define the nature and extent of contamination in soil, groundwater, soil vapor, and any other parts of the environment that may be affected.

Previous investigations have detected pesticides, metals, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons, and herbicides in the soil.

Key components of the investigation work include:

- Advancing test pits and soil borings for the purpose of collecting analytical samples to identify
  possible on-site sources of contamination;
- Collecting soil vapor samples; and
- Installing and sampling groundwater wells to monitor impacts from areas of concern on-site.

#### **Next Steps**

NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the plan as necessary, and approve the work plan. NYSDOH must concur with the plan. After the work plan is approved, the activities detailed in the work plan will be implemented.

When the investigation is completed, a report will be prepared and submitted to NYSDEC that summarizes the results. NYSDEC will review the report, make any necessary revisions and, if appropriate, approve the report.

After the investigation, a proposed cleanup plan, called a "Draft Remedial Investigation / Alternative Analysis Report" will be developed. The cleanup plan will include an evaluation of the proposed site actions, or recommend a no action or no further action alternative. The goal of the cleanup plan is to ensure the protection of public health and the environment. NYSDEC will present the proposed cleanup plan to the public for its review and comment during a 45-day comment period.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

#### **Site Description**

The 5.08-acre site is located in the Town of Amherst. It is bordered on the south by Sheridan Drive and residential properties to the north, east, and west. Six structures including two residential buildings, a shed, and three storage garages were demolished in March 2025. The site is currently vacant, covered with asphalt driveway and vegetated areas. The site was originally developed for residential purposes in 1930 and converted into a landscaping business and plant nursery in the 1950s. The landscaping and plant nursery ceased operations in 2020.

The planned redevelopment for the site includes construction of eleven two-story, two-unit townhouses with attached garages, a private driveway, stormwater management areas, and greenspace.

#### **Brownfield Cleanup Program**

New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.
