1501 College Ave Update: DEC Certifies Cleanup Requirements Achieved at Brownfield Site

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) has determined that the cleanup requirements to address contamination related to 1501 College Avenue Site ("site") located at 1501 College Avenue, Niagara Falls, Niagara County under New York State's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) have been met. Please see **Site Location** for a map of the site.

The cleanup activities were performed by SANTAROSA HOLDINGS, INC. with oversight provided by DEC. DEC has issued a Certificate of Completion regarding the site. A copy of the Notice of the Certificate of Completion is available at the locations identified below under "Where to Find Information."

Institutional and Engineering Controls

Institutional controls and engineering controls generally are designed to reduce or eliminate exposure to contaminants of concern. An *institutional control* is a non-physical restriction on use of the site, such as a deed restriction, when contamination left over after the cleanup action makes the site suitable for some, but not all uses. An *engineering control* is a physical barrier or method to manage contamination such as a cap or vapor barrier.

The following institutional controls have been put in place on the site:

Next Steps

DEC issued the Certificate of Completion to the applicant (or applicants, if appropriate) based on review and approval of a Final Engineering Report. The Final Engineering Report includes:

- 1. A description of the cleanup activities completed;
- 2. Certification that cleanup requirements have been or will be achieved for the site;
- 3. A description of any institutional/engineering controls to be used; and
- 4. A certification that a site management plan for any engineering controls used at the site has been approved by DEC.

With its receipt of a Certificate of Completion, the applicant is eligible to redevelop the site. In addition, the applicant:

- Has no liability to the State for contamination at or coming from the site, subject to certain conditions; and
- Is eligible for tax credits to offset the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site.

A Certificate of Completion may be modified or revoked if, for example, there is a failure to comply with the terms of the order or agreement with DEC.


