Months after violation, **DEC's penalty for Covanta** facility still not finalized

Niagara Gazette — The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation says it is still negotiating the terms of a penalty for a local waste-to-energy facility that violated state law when it installed a new smokestack without an approved air permit last year.

DEC spokesperson Megan Gollwitzer confirmed last week that agency officials are still working on a consent order tied to last year's decision by Covanta Niagara to start construction on a boiler system and smokestack at its facility off 56th Street without having a state-sanctioned permit in place.

Gollwitzer indicated that the DEC would make a copy of the final consent order available to the media and the public once it is completed.

"DEC is currently in negotiations with Covanta on a consent order that will include a penalty," Gollwitzer said in an emailed response to questions from the Niagara Gazette. "Since it is an ongoing enforcement action, we are unable to comment in greater detail at this time."

Covanta Niagara burns hundreds of thousands of tons of waste at its Falls facility, turning it into steam and electricity. Last year, the company embarked on an expansion project at its 56th Street plant that will include the installation of a new natural bas boiler and a 190-foot smokestack as well as the development of a rail spur to accommodate additional waste by train.

The DEC later confirmed that Covanta started work months before the public comment period on the project had closed.

At the time, officials at Covanta Niagara said the company "immediately" ceased construction, indicating that they misunderstood directions from the DEC that led them to believe they had authorization to move ahead with construction as long as a permit was in place before the boiler operated.

In an emailed response to the Niagara Gazette this week, Covanta Niagara spokesman James Regan said his company is currently working with the DEC to finalize a consent order and resolution. He said company officials were unable to comment further on those discussions at this time.



"Covanta Niagara's planned upgrades and improvements, which include building new rail infrastructure and a natural gas boiler, are important projects," Regan said in a statement. "The new boiler will ensure a consistent supply of steam energy for all the businesses in Niagara Falls that depend on Covanta and the new rail infrastructure will reduce truck deliveries to the facility by 30 (to) 50 percent."


