Cleanup Action to Begin at Petroleum Remediation Site

Action is about to begin that will address contamination related to the Cold Springs Hillside Road site ("site") located at 7430, 7431, 7433, 7437 Hillside Road, Baldwinsville, Onondaga County under New York's Petroleum Remediation Program. Please see the map for the site location. The cleanup activities will be performed by Southern Terminals Group ("remedial party") with oversight provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC).

Remedial activities are expected to begin in July 2022, and last 2-3 years.

Highlights of the Upcoming Cleanup Activities: The goal of the cleanup action for the site is to achieve cleanup levels that protect public health and the environment. The key components of the remedy are:

- Installation of an automated light non-aqueous phase liquid (LNAPL) skimmer system;
- Removal and off-site disposal of LNAPL and contaminated groundwater;
- Routine gauging of groundwater wells to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedy; and
- Recording an Environmental Easement to control future land use and to ensure implementation of the Site Management Plan.

A site-specific health and safety plan (HASP) and a Community Air Monitoring Plan (CAMP) will be implemented during remediation activities. The HASP and CAMP establish procedures to protect on-site workers and residents and includes required air monitoring as well as dust and odor suppression measures.

Next Steps: After cleanup activities are completed, the remedial party will prepare a Final Engineering Report (FER). The FER will describe the cleanup activities completed and certify that cleanup requirements have been achieved or will be achieved.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the cleanup of the site.

PETROLEUM REMEDIATION PROGRAM

Site Description: The site is approximately 6-acres and is bordered on the east by residential properties, on the west by a cemetery, on the south by the Seneca River, and on the north by woods and residential properties. It is currently developed with three dilapidated office buildings and three petroleum transport truck loading racks. The facility ceased operations as an industrial oil terminal in early 2014 and the site is currently unoccupied. The site is separated into two operable units (OU), the Southern Terminals Group OU and Northern Terminals Group OU. The Northern Terminal Groups remedial design and action will begin once the Southern Terminal Group completes their remedial action.

Summary of the Investigation: The primary contaminant of concern at the site is LNAPL, which is present site-wide in soil and groundwater, primarily in the area of the former tanks.

Petroleum Remediation Program: New York's State Petroleum Remediation Program identifies and characterizes suspected chemical and petroleum spill sites. Sites go through a process of investigation, evaluation, cleanup, and monitoring.

NYSDEC attempts to identify parties responsible for site contamination and require cleanup before committing State funds.


