Activities Performed During Past Month: The following actions have taken place in the past month:

- A electromagnetic (EM) survey was completed by Geomatrix of Buffalo, New York within the City of Rochester Easement, located on the western side of the property, to locate the City of Rochester water lines.
- A Work Plan Addendum for the additional work anticipated on the east and southwest sides of the property was submitted to NYSDEC on 23 June 2000.

Results of Sampling to Date: Geomatrix completed an EM survey within the City of Rochester Easement on 16 June 2000. This letter is the thirteenth progress report as required by the Voluntary Cleanup Agreement (VCA) between Coopervision, Inc. and the New York State DEC. The project status update is intended to meet the requirements of Section II of the VCA.

Activities Performed During Past Month: The following actions have taken place since the previous progress report was submitted.

- □ A draft Remediation Work Plan is being completed and is expected to be submitted to NYSDEC during the week of 12 June 2000.
- Groundwater results from the April 2000 sampling event were received and reviewed by Haley & Aldrich.

Results of Sampling to Date: The groundwater results from the April 2000 sampling event (see data in Attached Table) indicated that CVOC concentrations in all of the sampled wells (OWD-302D, OWS-302S, OWS-302D, OWD-302S and MW-401) decreased with the exception of OWS-302S where the concentration increased, and OWD-302S which was not previously sampled due to insufficient water volumes.

In addition to laboratory VOC analyses, Haley & Aldrich collected groundwater parameters needed for HRC injection design for several of the site wells (all those sampled for VOCs as well as the OW303 cluster, MW-205, MW-202, MW-201, OW-304 and MW-403). A table of the measured parameters is attached.

Reports and Deliverables: No reports or other materials were submitted or were required to be submitted during the last month.

The samples were submitted for VOC analyses with the exception of MW-205, which was submitted for metals analyses.
- □ In addition to groundwater sampling, several groundwater parameters were collected at the wells that were sampled as well as several other wells around the site.
