Cleanup Proposed for State Superfund Site; Public Comment Period and Public Meeting Announced

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) invites you to a public meeting to discuss the cleanup plan proposed for the site. You are encouraged to provide comments at the meeting, and during the 30-day comment period described in this fact sheet.

Language interpretation services shall be made available to persons with limited English proficiency, including American Sign Language, at no cost. Requests can be directed to the NYSDEC Division of Communication, Education, and Engagement by mail (address: NYSDEC, 625 Broadway, Albany, New York 12233-4500), e-mail (language@dec.ny.gov), or phone (518) 402-8028.

The public is invited to comment on a proposed cleanup plan by the DEC, in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) to address contamination related to the 3901 Route 104 site ("site") located at 3901 Route 104, town of Williamson, Wayne County. Please see the map for the site location. The estimated cost to implement the cleanup is \$405,459.

How to Comment

DEC is accepting written comments about the proposed plan, called a Proposed Remedial Action Plan (PRAP) for 30 days, from **February 12** through **March 14, 2026**.

The site is listed as a Class "2" site in the State Registry of Inactive Hazardous Waste Sites (list of State Superfund sites). A Class 2 site represents a significant threat to public health or the environment; action is required. DEC is proposing the following cleanup to address these threats.

Proposed Remedial Action Plan

The proposed cleanup for the site includes:

- In-situ treatment of contaminated groundwater by injecting chemical oxidizers to break down the

- groundwater contamination;
- Implement a Health and Safety Plan;
- Implement a Site Management Plan (SMP) for long term groundwater monitoring; and
- Recording of an Environmental Easement to ensure proper use of the site may be necessary.

DEC Developed the proposed cleanup after reviewing the detailed investigation of the site and evaluating the cleanup options in the “Feasibility Study” submitted under New York’s State Superfund Program by HRP Associates, Inc.

Next Steps

DEC will consider public comments as it finalizes the cleanup of the site. The selected cleanup plan will be described in a document called a "Record of Decision" that will explain why the plan was selected and respond to public comments. A detailed design of the selected cleanup will then be prepared, and the cleanup will be performed.

DEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

Site Description

The site is a 0.43-acre site which is approximately 0.3 miles east of the intersection of State Route 104 and State Route 21. The site is bounded to the east by a car dealership and to the west by a gas station. The site is bounded to the north by Railroad Avenue and to the south by State Route 104. Previously the site had been used as a dry cleaner in the 1980s. The site historically included a 1,400 square foot former dry-cleaning structure which was demolished in 2022; currently the site is undeveloped and unoccupied.

The proposed cleanup is intended to allow the use and development of the site for commercial use as defined by Part 375-1.8(g), although land use is subject to local zoning laws.

Summary of the Investigation

The primary contaminants of concern at the site are chlorinated volatile organic compounds (CVOCs) which are present in the soil and groundwater.

State Superfund Program

New York’s State Superfund Program (SSF) identifies and characterizes suspected inactive hazardous waste disposal sites. Sites that pose a significant threat to public health and/or the environment go through a process of investigation, evaluation, cleanup and monitoring.

DEC attempts to identify parties responsible for site contamination before committing State funds for investigation and cleanup.

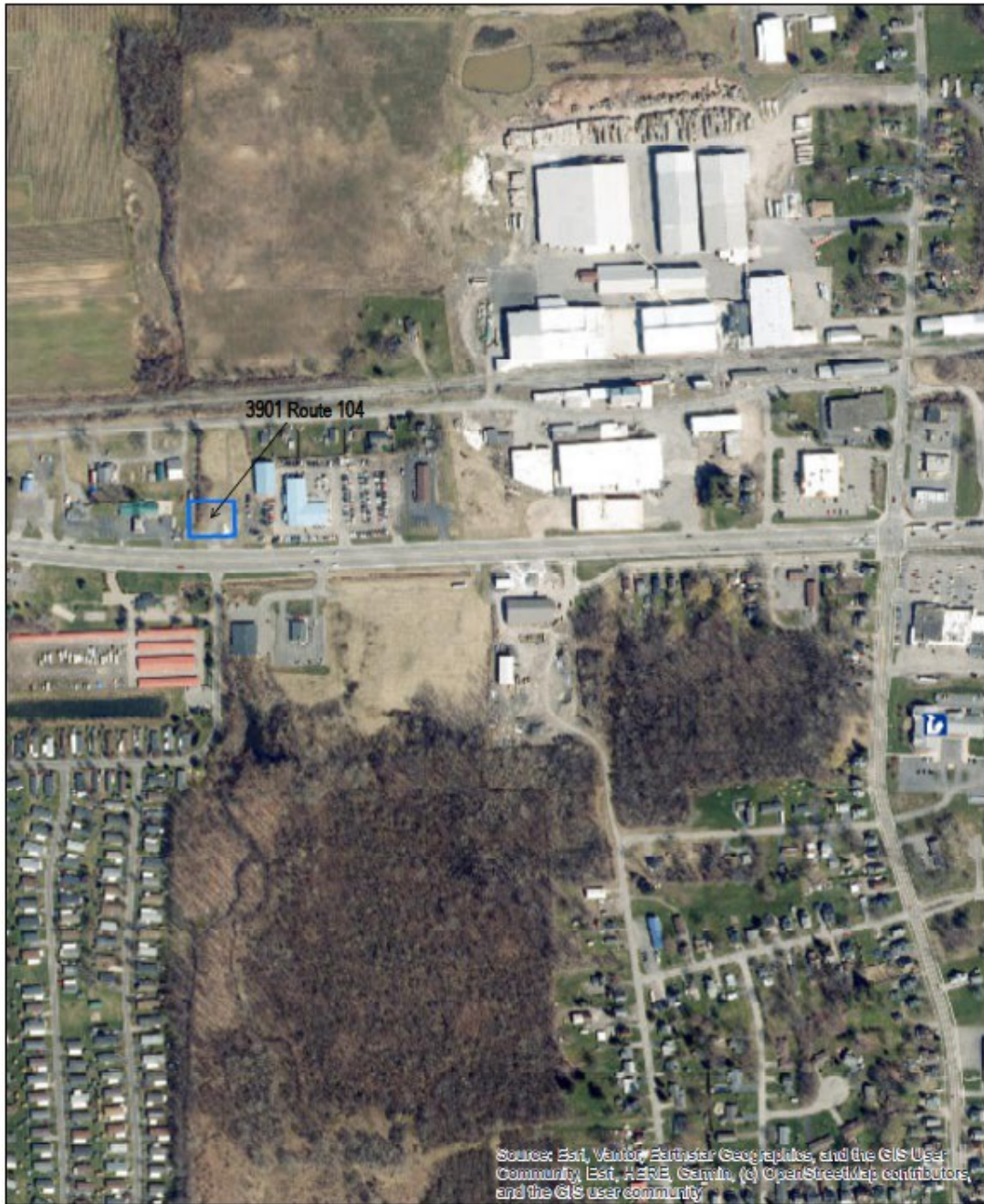

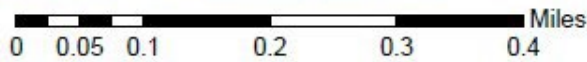
