Draft Investigation Work Plan for Brownfield Site Available for Public Comment

The public is invited to comment on a draft work plan being reviewed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) to investigate the 615 Broadway site ("site") located at 615 Broadway in Kingston, Ulster County. Please see the map for the site location.

Draft Investigation Work Plan: The draft investigation work plan, called a "Remedial Investigation Work Plan," (RIWP) was submitted to NYSDEC under New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program. The investigation will be performed by 615 Broadway LLC ("volunteer") with oversight by NYSDEC and the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH).

How to Comment: NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the Draft RIWP for 30 days, from **June 4 through July 4, 2025.**

Highlights of the Proposed Site Investigation: The investigation will define the nature and extent of contamination in soil, surface water, groundwater and any other parts of the environment that may be affected.

Previous investigations have detected semi-volatile organic compounds (SVOCs) and metals in soil, chlorinate volatile organic compounds (CVOC) and metals in groundwater, and CVOCs in soil vapor.

Key components of the investigation work include:

- Drilling and sampling soil borings to identify possible on-site sources of contamination; and
- · Collecting soil vapor samples; and
- Installing and sampling ground water wells to monitor impacts from areas of concern on-site.

Next Steps: NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the plan as necessary, and approve the work plan. NYSDOH must concur with the plan. After the work plan is approved, the activities detailed in the work plan will be implemented.

When the investigation is completed, a report will be prepared and submitted to NYSDEC that summarizes the results. NYSDEC will review the report, make any necessary revisions and, if appropriate, approve the report.

After the investigation, a proposed cleanup plan, called a "Draft Remedial Action Work Plan" will be developed. The cleanup plan will include an evaluation of the proposed site remedy or recommend a no action or no further action alternative. The goal of the cleanup plan is to ensure the protection of public health and the environment. NYSDEC will present the proposed cleanup plan to the public for its review and comment during a 45-day comment period.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

Site Description: The site is 0.77 acres and located at 615 Broadway within an urbanized area of Kingston, New York, and is identified on the Ulster County Tax Map as Section 56.109, Tax Block 3, Lot 16. The site is irregularly shaped and includes an about 10-foot-wide by 200-foot-long accessway formerly known as Martin's Lane that extends to the southeast towards Cedar Street. The site is vacant and improved with an asphaltpaved parking lot and a landscaped area in the eastern part of the site fronting Broadway. Block 3 is bordered by Henry Street to the north, Broadway to the east, Cedar Street to the south, and Sterling Street to the west. property uses include Surrounding residential commercial, and institutional use buildings, including a gasoline filling station to the north and a Salvation Army church and food distribution center to the south. Historic site uses are residential and commercial including a produce warehouse (1950s) and a motel (1970s to 2000s). The proposed redevelopment is a mixed-use commercial and residential building with a planned affordable housing component.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by NYSDEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.
