Investigation Completed; Cleanup Remedy Proposed for Brownfield Site Contamination; Public Comment Period Announced

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), is reviewing the Remedial Investigation Report (RIR) and the proposed Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP) for the Hamilton Green site ("site") located at 200 Hamilton Avenue, White Plains, Westchester County. Please see the map for the site location. The public is invited to review the draft investigation report and comment on the proposed remedy. Based on the findings of the investigation, NYSDEC, in consultation with the NYSDOH, has determined that the site does not pose a significant threat to public health or the environment.

How to Comment: NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the proposed plan for 45 days, from October 16 through November 30, 2024.

Draft Remedial Work Plan: The proposed Unrestricted Use remedy consists of:

- Excavation and off-site disposal of contaminated soil to approximately 30 feet below ground surface across the entirety of the site;
- Treating contaminated groundwater during excavation via a pump and treat system prior to permitted discharge to the sanitary sewer;
- Collecting and analyzing post-remedial soil and groundwater samples to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedy;
- Importing clean material that meets the established Soil Cleanup Objectives for use as backfill;
- A soil vapor intrusion evaluation will be completed for future buildings;
- Implementing a Health and Safety Plan and Community Air Monitoring Plan during all ground intrusive activities;
- If an Unrestricted Use cleanup is not achieved, implementation of a Site Management Plan (SMP) would also be required for long term maintenance of the remedial systems.
- If an Unrestricted Use cleanup is not achieved, recording of an Environmental Easement to ensure proper use of the site may be necessary.

BROWNFIELD CLEANUP PROGRAM

The proposed remedy was developed by S-WP/WD LLC ("applicant(s)") after performing a detailed investigation of the site under New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP). A "Remedial Investigation Report", which describes the results of the site investigation was submitted concurrently with the Remedial Action Work Plan and is also available for review at the locations identified on Page 1.

Next Steps: NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the cleanup plan as necessary, and issue a final Decision Document. NYSDOH must concur with the proposed remedy. After approval, the proposed remedy becomes the selected remedy. The applicant(s) may then design and perform the cleanup action to address the site contamination, with oversight by NYSDEC and NYSDOH.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

Site Description: The site is a vacant 1.94-acre area located in an urban downtown setting. It is bordered on the north by Barker Avenue, the east by the WP Mall Cleaners & Gas Station BCP site, number C360221, the south by Hamilton Avenue, and the west by Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. The Bronx River is located approximately 0.6 miles west of the site. Historically, the site contained several residences with garages, a dry-cleaning establishment, and a gasoline station located in the southern portion of the site with three gasoline tanks. The gasoline station ceased operations prior to 1972 when the White Plains Mall was constructed. The Mall was demolished in 2022 and the site has been vacant since.

The redevelopment plan is to construct a residential apartment building including 470 apartments, with groundfloor retail and restaurants, green spaces, and 515 underground parking spaces.

https://extapps.dec.ny.gov/cfmx/extapps/derexternal/index.cfm?pag eid=3 **Summary of the Investigation:** Volatile organic compounds (VOCs), semi-volatile organic compounds (SVOCs), metals, pesticides, and per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) were found in subsurface soils at concentrations above unrestricted use soil cleanup objectives. These exceedances have been detected at depths up to 30 feet below grade and are likely the result of past site uses and the historic fill which is present throughout the site. Groundwater has VOC, SVOC, metals, and PFAS exceedances. Soil vapor has detections of several VOCs.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.


