Interim Remedial Measure Proposed Public Comment Period Announced

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), is announcing an expedited cleanup of contamination at the 5 Westchester Plaza site ("site") located at 5 Westchester Plaza, Elmsford, New York, Westchester County. Please see the map for the site location. NYSDEC is conducting a public comment period because this Interim Remedial Measure (IRM) is likely to represent a significant part of the cleanup for the site. The cleanup activities are expected to begin in September 2024 and last about 2 months. The activities will be performed by Mack-Cali CW Realty Associates LLC ("applicant") with oversight by NYSDEC.

How to Comment: NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the Interim Remedial Measure for 30 days, from July 31 through August 30, 2024.

Interim Remedial Measure (IRM) Pilot Test Work Plan: An IRM is a cleanup activity that may be performed when a source of contamination or exposure pathway (the way in which a person may contact contamination) can be effectively addressed without extensive investigation and evaluation.

The IRM work plan describes upcoming cleanup activities that include:

- Pilot testing to determine vapor extraction locations and the SSDS equipment requirements for the building;
- Schedule for submittal of pilot test results, final SSDS design, and installation of the system;
- Installation of a Sub-slab Depressurization System (SSDS) at 5 Westchester Plaza.

Site Description: 5 Westchester Plaza (site) consists of one approximately 20,200 square foot commercial/industrial building built in 1968. The building is of single-story construction, with no basement. Landscaped areas are located around the building and concrete sidewalks lead to asphalt parking lots to the north, south, and west of the building. Loading docks are present on the rear of the building located to the north.

From 1983 to 2007, a resource conservation and recovery act (RCRA) hazardous waste generator operated as a tenant in the warehouse. Generation of chlorinated volatile organic compounds (CVOCs) including tetrachloroethylene (PCE) & trichloroethylene (TCE) can be attributed to this former tenant.

The site is currently active with commercial tenants and is currently zoned for Non-residential Planned Development. The on-site commercial building is divided into five separate leaseholds.

Summary of the Investigation: The primary contaminants of concern at the site are CVOCs which are present site-wide in soil vapor. CVOCs have been identified in the sub-slab soil vapor beneath the Site.

Next Steps: NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the plan as necessary, and approve the IRM work plan in consultation with the New York State Department of Health. The approved work plan will be made available to the public (see "Where to Find Information" on the front page).

When the expedited cleanup activities are completed, a Construction Completion Report will be prepared that documents the activities that were performed.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.
