NYSDEC Certifies Cleanup Requirements Achieved at Brownfield Site

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) has determined that the cleanup requirements to address contamination related to the Hertel and Foundry site ("site") located at 356 Hertel Avenue and 42 Foundry Street in Buffalo, Erie County, under New York State's Brownfield Cleanup Program have been or will be met. Please see the attached map for the site location.

The cleanup activities were performed by Kam Cleanup LLC ("applicant") with oversight provided by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC). NYSDEC has approved a Final Engineering Report (FER) and issued a Certificate of Completion (COC) for the site.

Completion of the Project: The following activities have been completed to achieve the remedial action objectives:

• Excavation and off-site disposal of about 37,009 tons of non-hazardous soil/fill material from the exterior areas of the site and 105 tons of non-hazardous soil/fill from the interior of the site, which exceeded the unrestricted use soil cleanup objectives (USCOs), the site-specific cleanup criteria. Clean fill was brought in to replace the excavated soil.

Final Engineering Report Approved: NYSDEC has approved the FER, which:

- 1) Describes the cleanup activities completed.
- 2) Certifies that cleanup requirements have been or will be achieved for the site.

Next Steps: With its receipt of a COC, the applicant is eligible to redevelop the site. In addition, the applicant is eligible for tax credits to offset the costs of performing cleanup activities and for redevelopment of the site. A COC may be modified or revoked if, for example, there is a failure to comply with the terms of the order or agreement with NYSDEC.

Site Description: The site is an approximately 2.965-acre site, comprised of two contiguous parcels, located in a highly developed urban area at 356 Hertel Avenue and 42 Foundry Street in the City of Buffalo, Erie County. The site is on the northwest corner of the intersection of Hertel Avenue and Foundry Street and is bordered by vacant commercial and industrial properties to the north, railroad tracks to the west, and Foundry Street and residential, commercial, and vacant industrial properties to the east. Historically, the site was used for industrial purposes (1901-1950), and an insulation contactor occupied the site from 1965-1986. Specific operations included a malting operation and animal feed production operation.

The redevelopment plans at the site include apartments and retail space.

Brownfield Cleanup Program: New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by NYSDEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.


