# Cleanup Proposed for Brownfield Site Contamination; Public Comment Period Announced

The public is invited to comment on a proposed remedy being reviewed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), in consultation with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH), to address contamination related to Amherst Commons LLC site ("site") located at 47 East Amherst Street, Buffalo, Erie County. Please see the map for the site location.

## **How to Comment**

NYSDEC is accepting written comments about the proposed plan, called a "Draft Remedial Investigation/ Alternatives Analysis Report (RI/AAR)" for 45 days, from **July 2 through August 15**, **2025**.

## **Draft Remedial Investigation/ Alternatives Analysis Report**

The proposed Track 4 Restricted Residential Use Alternative remedy plan consists of:

- Excavation and off-site disposal of approximately 8,500 tons of soil;
- Importing approximately 4,500 tons of clean material that meets the established Soil Cleanup Objectives for use as fill for the partial basement of the existing building to bring up to design grade;
- Importing approximately 2,000 tons of clean fill to provide a two foot cover system in greenspace areas;
- If sub-slab soil vapor samples indicate soil vapor concerns, then a Sub-Slab Depressurization System (SSDS) will be installed in the proposed building;
- Implementing a Health and Safety Plan and Community Air Monitoring Plan during all ground intrusive activities;
- Implementation of a Site Management Plan for long term maintenance of the remedial systems;
   and
- Recording of an Environmental Easement to ensure proper use of the site.

The proposed cleanup plan was developed by Amherst Commons LLC ("applicant") after performing a detailed investigation of the site under New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP).

#### **Next Steps**

NYSDEC will consider public comments, revise the remedy plan as necessary, and issue a final Decision Document. NYSDOH must concur with the proposed cleanup. After approval, the proposed cleanup becomes the selected cleanup. The applicant may then design and perform the cleanup action to address the site contamination, with oversight by NYSDEC and NYSDOH.

NYSDEC will keep the public informed throughout the investigation and cleanup of the site.

#### **Site Description**

The site is a 3.33-acre site, located in an urban area in the City of Buffalo, Erie County. The site is bounded by East Amherst Street to the north, Holden Street to the east, a retail store and lawn service shop to the south, and Pannell Street to the west. The site contains one vacant building surrounded by an asphalt parking lot. The building is two stories with a partial basement. Access to the second floor and basement is currently limited to structural issues. The interior and exterior of the building have significant deterioration. The site was previously occupied by Buffalo Cement Co. up until 1935, and then was occupied by multiple Bowling Centers up until 2004.

Planned redevelopment for the site involves demolishing the existing building and constructing a 139,281-square- foot affordable housing unit containing 134 residential units. This building is proposed as a 3-story stacked unit type with 1-, 2-, and 3-bedroom units. The Volunteer plans to remediate the property to meet restricted residential use standards.

## **Summary of the Investigation**

The primary contaminants of concern at the site are, semi-volatile organic compounds (SVOCs) and metals, which are present site-wide in the soil.

#### **Brownfield Cleanup Program**

New York's Brownfield Cleanup Program (BCP) encourages the voluntary cleanup of contaminated properties known as "brownfields" so that they can be reused and redeveloped. These uses may include recreation, housing, business or other uses. A brownfield site is any real property where a contaminant is present at levels exceeding the soil cleanup objectives or other health-based or environmental standards, criteria or guidance adopted by DEC that are applicable based on the reasonably anticipated use of the property, in accordance with applicable regulations.
