

Regenerate NY Forestry Cost Share Grant Program (RNY)

Pre-Application Questions

I own land enrolled in the 480-a forest tax law program. The 5-year plan includes beech control. Is this program suitable for this purpose?

Yes, the competing vegetation control practice can be used to eradicate or limit the spread of native or exotic invasive plant species in forested environments which interfere with using management practices that support the forest owner's goals for regeneration.

Can an applicant apply for a Round 3 grant if they received a Round 1 or Round 2 grant?

Yes, if a landowner was awarded a grant from an earlier round, they would be eligible for Round 3 also. The work had to be on additional acreage not included in the previous round practices.

Is it required that seedlings be purchased through the DEC tree nursery?

Seedlings may be purchased from the DEC nursery but are not required. Applicants may procure seedlings through various tree nurseries.

What period of time does the 65% survivability refer to? The term of the grant?

Total seedling survival must be 65% or greater during the three-year contract period to receive full reimbursement for this practice

Can TSI/FSI be included in Competing Vegetation Control for other than beech that will be chemically treated?

Timber Stand Improvement or Forest Stand Improvement may be funded but needs to be part of a forest regeneration project and not just improving growing conditions

Is landowner work ONLY eligible for match? Or can the landowner be the primary worker eligible for reimbursement?

Landowners who work on the project can claim reimbursement in the Salary category or they can use their time as match.

For Private Land owners, we have to pay vendor invoices and then wait for approval and then we get reimbursed? is there any support to ease the \$ burden for larger projects, say 20+ acres?

Quarterly vouchers can be submitted for work performed and with approval, interim vouchers may be submitted. DEC/NYS want to expedite payments to landowners when applicable.

We are adjacent property owners. Can we submit a joint application for our overlapping 5-acre area?

No, Projects cannot be submitted by adjacent/adjoining landowners. Projects are only allowed on lands under contiguous ownership.

I thought that I read, that one extended objective or purpose is for erosion control. If so, do projects that directly address erosion mitigation or correction (drainage) projects qualify?

Successful projects assist landowners in the cost of establishing successful forest regeneration or creating conditions necessary for successful regeneration. If erosion is a concern, mitigation strategies and/or measures should be explained. Best management practices should be planned, installed, and maintained when necessary.

If a land trust owns the property, can land trusts apply as the landowner? Or must it always be on-behalf of a private landowner?

If a land trust owns a property in fee, they are considered an eligible applicant.

Is there no up fronting of funds- it is 100% reimbursement based?

Non-for-Profit applicants may apply for a 25% advance that is paid back in increments over each submitted voucher. Private landowners will fund phases of the project and submit quarterly or interim vouchers to be reimbursed.

Can we work with a DEC forester, or are we required to hire a consulting forester?

Landowners must work with a consulting forester or natural resource professionals to submit a project. Landowners can discuss projects with a DEC forester for input but are unable to provide technical numbers or grant preparation.

How do we get into the program when we can't get a forest management plan due to limited funding?

Forest management plans are not a requirement for the grant opportunity. However, the practice template is required to be completed.

If a tree planting project is trying to mitigate loss due to tree disease and pest issues, are "competing native tree species" still expected to be controlled?

Supplemental planting can be allowed in forest openings. The applicant will provide the number of trees or trees, or acre required to adequately supplement existing regeneration. Site factors, current

forest type, and light conditions are crucial for overall project success and will be used in the evaluation process.

Is a boundary survey eligible in a deer exclosure project? Sorry for the late question, will send via email. Thanks for presentation.

No, a boundary line survey would not be an eligible cost for reimbursement

Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. *What is Regenerate NY (RNY)?*** The [Regenerate New York Forestry Cost Share Grant Program](#) is intended to improve forest regeneration on private forest land through the use of certain forestry practices. RNY accomplishes this by reimbursing private forest landowners for up to 80% of qualifying practices.
- 2. *Who is eligible for grant funding?*** Any private landowner with planning a project on 5 acres of forestland or land suitable for establishing forestland (if planting) may apply for and receive funding. Eligibility thresholds apply to a single tax parcel or multiple tax parcels which are contiguous (adjacent) to each other. The applicant must include a plan to maintain their practices in their work plan. A private landowner can also use a not-for-profit fiscal sponsor. In addition, the local Soil and Water Conservation District can apply on behalf of a landowner, under a letter of agreement.
- 3. *What is a Fiscal Sponsor?*** A fiscal sponsor is an organization including a quasi-government agency (SWCD), a private forestry business, natural resource business focused on tree planting, NFP organization that applies to DEC on behalf of individuals or unincorporated organizations or groups. For Regenerate NY, a landowner would need to provide a letter of agreement, via Grants Gateway, from the organization as proof that it agrees to become a landowner's fiscal sponsor. The letter of agreement will need to be uploaded to the grants gateway as part of the grant application process. Because the organization is taking on the cost of installing the practices in place of the landowner, the organization will get reimbursed instead of the landowner. Land trusts and other conservation organizations that work with forest landowners may fit well as a fiscal sponsor.
- 4. *How can RNY help me?*** RNY can reimburse private landowners for the cost of conducting forestry practices designed to establish, enhance, and protect tree seedlings on their property. Landowners must provide a 25% match of the grant funds awarded.
- 5. *Do I have to pay a matching amount?*** Yes. The landowner is responsible for matching 25% of the awarded grant amount. The grant award is the amount of money awarded to the landowner, not the total project cost. For example, for a \$25,000 project with a \$20,000 grant award, the landowner will provide \$5,000 of match. A worksheet in the Grants Gateway will help calculate the landowner match.

6. ***What practices qualify for RNY?*** A variety of practices are available to aid in forest regeneration management including –afforestation/reforestation, forest stand restoration, competing vegetation control, and deer exclosures (including slash walls). Practice details can be found at the DEC [Regenerate NY website](#) and in the Request for Applications.
7. ***How do I get started?*** Potential applicants need to apply for access to the [Grants Gateway](#). Once you receive a username and pin/password you are eligible to submit a grant on the gateway. **It can take a few weeks to receive access.** Follow the instructions on the Grants Gateway website for locating a grant opportunity and type in “Regenerate NY”. Then, follow the instructions to fill out the application. It is recommended that your forester assist you with the project details, but the landowner must be the person who starts and submits the application.
8. ***I have a Forest Stewardship Plan for part of my property, is that enough?*** No, while a Forest Stewardship Plan is a sound beginning for planning forestry practices, a Practice Template form and a work plan must be developed through the Grants Gateway by the landowner working closely with a consulting forester or natural resource professional (for planting projects only).
9. ***What are the elements of a work plan?*** A work plan is developed by the landowner and consulting forester. Basic information such as the initial condition of your project area, the desired future condition, and the methods you will use to meet the desired future condition. Other elements may be required depending on the practice and are explained further in the standards and specifications of each approved practice.
10. ***Is there a limit to the amount of cost-share I can receive?*** Yes. Participants may receive grants between \$10,000 and \$100,000 per round. There is a limit of 2 applications per round and one application per property. Multiple practices (such as planting and deer exclosures) are allowed on a single property.
11. ***Do I need to hire a private forester or natural resource professional to qualify for Regenerate NY grants?*** Yes, to be eligible for funding, a landowner needs to hire a private forester or a natural resource professional. Foresters can be hired to complete the project planning, administration, and operations-related forestry services which are reimbursable under the program. A qualified natural resources professional can be used for planning and implementing tree planting projects.
12. ***Can the landowner complete some of the work on the project?*** Yes, the landowner can perform some work and get reimbursed as part of the grant and/or the landowner efforts can be part of the required match. Details are available in the Regenerate NY Request For Applications.
13. ***Where can I go to hire a forester or other contractor?*** There are several options. First, visit the [DEC Cooperating Forester Directory](#). Cornell Cooperative Extension also provides information on [working with foresters](#). Recommendations for other contractors can be made through your forester, neighbors, or others.

- 14. *If I make a profit on a timber sale can I still qualify for the cost-share?*** Yes, many of the approved practices can be used in conjunction with a timber sale to promote and protect forest regeneration. Specifically, the Forest Stand Restoration practice may result in a small profit from selling firewood or low-grade material through a marginal timber sale.
- 15. *Who can obligate funds and authorize payments?*** Grantees must submit all necessary documentation to DEC via email, including their voucher and expense information, in order to receive payment.
- 16. *Who decides which projects get funded?*** DEC Lands and Forests staff will determine which applications will be approved for funding. As part of this review process, a [DEC Service Forester](#) in your region will visit your property.
- 17. *How long will it take until I receive my cost-share payment?*** As part of the contracting process, the grantees will supply a W-9 tax form to facilitate payments from New York State. Once you complete the practices, you must submit documentation of the actual costs (paid invoices, cancelled checks, receipts, landowner work log, etc.) of installing the practices. The DEC will authorize the cost share payment within 30 days of receiving all of the required documentation from the applicant.
- 18. *Why wasn't I approved?*** There are 2 reasons that an application may not be approved. The first is that the landowner did not meet the eligibility requirements for the practices they applied for. The second is that no funds are available at the time the application was submitted.
- 19. *If I am not selected this year due to lack of funds, will you hold my application for next year?*** No, applicants that do not get funded in Round 1 will need to reapply for subsequent rounds.
- 20. *How long do I have to complete my forest practice?*** If awarded, the landowner will have three years to complete the practice and will need to sign a contract with New York State.
- 21. *What are the tax implications of cost-share payments?*** Landowner must consult with a tax professional to determine their own tax liability.
