

Fishing Heritage Scenic Tour | Sullivan County



Suggested Route: From Livingston Manor, head north on County Route 178/179. Turn left on Covered Bridge Road to see the Livingston Manor Covered Bridge or fish Willowemoc Creek. Return to CR178/179 north and turn right at CR151. Continue north passing Waneta Lake. Turn left onto Campsite Road to the Beaverkill Campground. Turn right at Berry Brook Road to see the Beaver Kill Covered Bridge or fish at the day-use area (anticipate bridge restoration). Return to the Campsite Road intersection. South of the intersection, Berry Brook Road ends and Craigie Clair Road begins. Continue on Craigie Clair Road. Turn right and cross the iron bridge over the Beaver Kill. Turn left onto Beaverkill Valley Road. Turn left onto State Route 206 to Roscoe and fish the Beaver Kill at two angler parking areas. Travel east on CR178/179 back to Livingston Manor. Several angler parking areas give you access to Willowemoc Creek.

Length: About 19 miles

## **Scenic Vistas:**

- CR151 Parking Area—Lovely view overlooking Waneta Lake.
- Covered Bridges—Enduring historic landmarks in Livingston Manor and at Beaverkill Campground.

## **Attractions:**

- World renowned trout fishing—Try your luck in New York's legendary trout streams Beaver Kill and Willowemoc Creek.
- Catskill Fly Fishing Center and Museum, Livingston Manor—Discover the rich history of this most elegant angling art in New York State.
- Catskill Art Society Arts Center, Livingston Manor—Stroll the gallery or attend a special event.
- Catskill Fish Hatchery, DeBruce—See how trout are raised for stocking in water bodies throughout New York State.

**Dining:** Eateries from diners to cafes and farm markets.

**Accommodations:** The sites at DEC's Beaverkill Campground are uniquely set along the Beaver Kill. If camping is not your style, you can also find motels and bed-and-breakfasts.
