The New York Farm Bureau (NYFB) and the Niagara County Farm Bureau (NCFB) are requesting that the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) extend the comment period deadline on the proposed RMU-2- landfill- related applications by CWM Chemical Services, LLC. The current comment deadline is October 20, 2014; NYFB and NCFB are requesting that DEC extend the comment deadline to at least January 20, 2015.

DEC is requesting comments on the RMU-2 landfill permit applications during a busy time of the year for farmers. Our members, who would be affected by this proposed regulation, are now in the midst of harvesting their crops. It will be extremely difficult at this time of year to ask farmers to stop what they are doing, to familiarize them with the permit applications, their implications and to ask them to provide us with their analysis and judgment as to its impacts. 





Dear Judge McClymonds:

Mr. Darragh's letter is less than straightforward. Although CWM's Part 373 application was initially submitted in 2003, and went through a scoping process in 2006 in which I vigorously participated on behalf of Niagara County, in 2009 CWM proposed to move the footprint of RMU-2, and proposed to move some ancillary facilities, to avoid areas discovered to be contaminated, resulting in a new RMU-2 project application. On February 7, 2012, CWM submitted a revised RMU-2 Permit Application, "updat[ing] the scope and design of the RMU-2 project" and noting that the 2009 application which this submittal updated "replac[ed] in its entirety" the 2003 application. However, no additional scoping was conducted, and thereafter DEC Staff did not provide the new scope for public comment and did not issue any scoping document. The RMU-2 project applications continued to be developed thereafter and were not finalized until November and December of 2013.

Regarding comments on hydrogeological issues I have submitted on behalf of my clients, these were addressed to currently implemented or planned corrective actions. No RMU-2 issues were raised in these submissions, although Mr. Darragh correctly notes, as I did in my letter, some of the underlying factual issues may raise other issues (not yet identified) in the RMU-2 matter.

Also, Mr. Darragh suggests that consideration of the proposed CWM air and SPDES permit modifications are being deferred at this time until decisions on the Part 373 and Part 361 applications are issued. This raises potential concerns regarding fragmentation or segmentation of the decision-making process which, as noted in my letter, might be allayed by a public availability session with Staff to explain why. Whether potential stakeholders will be allowed to raise issues regarding these permits or, if not, whether such issues will be foreclosed by any approvals issued for the (arguably truncated) RMU-2 project is a question raised in my letter.

Also, Mr. Darragh insists that the application and supporting documents noticed for public review in the RMU-2 matter are sufficient to prepare for the issues conference, but this assertion is specifically challenged in my letter, which notes that substantial documentation outside these materials must be reviewed to understand and meaningfully criticize the project proposal. For example, in addition to hydrogeological issues, in recent years Niagara County has submitted to the Department several technical criticisms of the manner in which site radiological contamination has been investigated. In that regard, we have repeatedly pointed out to the Department that a history of radiological and other waste management at this site should be provided by CWM in order to identify locations where contamination is likely to exist. CWM has not done so, the Department has not directed it to do so, and therefore we must assemble, review and present the information available from past aerial surveys of the site, layouts of railroad lines, and other historical documents reporting on the location of past radiological waste management activities. This documentation is extensive and technical, and the need to fully review it is largely unique to this very complicated site and project proposal.

Finally, Mr. Darragh inappropriately attaches a letter from a resident of the Town of Lewiston (the Town clearly opposes the expansion as proposed), essentially attacking the Department's 2010 State Hazardous Waste Facility Siting Plan, which finds there is no need for an expansion of the Model City facility, and makes unsupported assertions about the impact of failing to approve the expansion. The writer works at a branch office of OP-TECH, Inc. which, according to its most recent 10-K filing (SEC No. 000-19761), is a small spill response company with offices in New York, Ohio and Pennsylvania, owned by a British company, and transports waste into New York from Massachusetts, New Hampshire and Jersey, as well as waste generated within New York. According to the Department's 2010 Hazardous Waste Facility Siting Plan, (p. 5-16), "With one exception [New Hampshire], all of the states located in New England, the Mid-Atlantic, and the Mid-West United States, . . . have at least one receiving [TSD] facility within their boundaries, with an average of 11 facilities per state." The impact of a complete loss of hazardous waste disposal capacity in any given location in New York was considered in the State Siting Plan and determined to be insignificant (p. 9-5). Mr. Darragh's letter attachment thus appears to be designed only to prejudice Your Honor with regard to my request for more time.
