Fac Pond 3 is within the footprint of RMU-2 so CWM has proposed construction of a new pond, Fac Pond 5, to replace Fac Pond 3. Variable amounts of stormwater runoff associated with RMU-2 would be discharged via outfall 002 to an unnamed tributary of Fourmile Creek and via outfall 003 to an unnamed subtributary of Fourmile Creek, both class C waterbodies

The Department has determined that construction and operation of the proposed RMU-2 has the potential to result in a new or increased discharge of bioaccumulative chemicals of concern (BCCs) from the facility to the Great Lakes Basin. Therefore, the proposal is subject to the Water Quality Antidegradation Policy, as well as TOGS 1.3.9.

Other proposed changes to the draft permit include: 1. The schedule for interim mercury limits at outfalls 001 and 01A has been modified so that these limits will expire June 1, 2019 or the date CWM begins receiving RMU-2 waste, whichever is sooner. 2. The schedules for interim PCB Aroclor limits at both internal and final stormwater outfalls have been modified so that these limits will expire June 1, 2019 or the date CWM begins receiving RMU-2 waste, whichever is sooner. 3. A special condition requiring pretreatment of B003 waste has been added to the draft permit as a means of further reducing PCB levels tributary to the wastewater treatment system. 4. A special condition prohibiting discharge of SLF 1-7 landfill leachate waste has been added to the draft permit. 5: The mercury minimization program requirements have been updated to include the "bulk chemical evaluation" component of the recently updated DEC mercury policy. 6. A new filter press would be required to be installed within one year of permit issuance. 7. A new monitoring locations page has been added to the draft permit to reflect conditions after initiation of RMU-2 waste acceptance.

Variable amounts of stormwater runoff asso-ciated with RMU-2 would be discharged via outfall 002 to an unnamed trib-utary of Fourmile Creek and via outfall 003 to an unnamed subtributary of Fourmile Creek, both class C waterbodies.

The Department has determined that construc-tion and operation of the proposed RMU-2 has the potential to result in a new or increased discharge of bioaccumula-tive chemicals of concern (BCCs) from the facility to the Great Lakes Basin Therefore, the proposal is subject to the Water Quality Antidegradation Policy, as well as TOGS 1.3.9.

Other proposed chang-es to the draft permit
